- 3. PARKING: Eagle Crest Ridge Course allows participants and spectators to park in the main course parking lot.
- **4.** SPECTATOR CONDUCT AT OSAA SANCTIONED EVENTS (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies) (Revised Winter 2015)

In addition to the general expectations included in the OSAA Constitution, Rule 3, that school officials "...shall take all reasonable measures to ensure that the school's students and supporters maintain a sportsmanlike attitude toward all events..." the following specific expectations regarding spectator conduct at all OSAA sanctioned events, including regular and post season competition, are provided:

- A. All cheers, comments and actions shall be in direct support of one's team. No cheers, comments or actions shall be directed at one's opponent or at contest officials. Some examples of inappropriate conduct or actions that are not permitted are: turning backs, holding up newspapers or jeering at cheerleaders during opposing team introductions; disrespecting players by name, number or position; negative cheers or chants; throwing objects on the floor.
- B. Spectators are not permitted to have signs or banners (larger than 8 ½ by 11 inches), confetti, balloons or glass containers. "Fathead" type items are considered signs and shall not be larger than 8 ½ by 11 inches. Spectators are required to wear shirts.
- C. Spectators are not permitted to have artificial noisemakers. Some examples of artificial noisemakers are Thunder Stix, cowbells, clappers and air horns.
- D. Spectators shall not be permitted to use vulgar/offensive or racially/culturally insensitive language. Spectators shall not be permitted to engage in any racially / culturally insensitive action.
- E. Spectators who fail to comply with Association or site management spectator conduct expectations may be expelled from the contest.
- 5. <u>CHEMICAL HEALTH POSITION</u> (Excerpt OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies)

(Revised Fall 2015)

C. The OSAA abides by all state laws and district policies pertaining to the use of tobacco, alcohol, cannabis and illegal drugs. As a general rule, OSAA activities' sites shall be tobacco, alcohol, cannabis and illegal drug free during OSAA events. All persons in attendance shall refrain from use of such substances at all OSAA activities and are prohibited from being influenced or impaired by such substances at all event facilities.

- 6. <u>SERVICE ANIMALS</u>: Trained guide dogs and service animals assisting guests are welcome at OSAA State Championships. All other animals are prohibited. All service animals must remain on a leash or in a harness, and be in full control of the handler, at all times. Handlers are responsible for any damage or injuries caused by their animals, must properly dispose of waste in appropriate containers and must take appropriate precautions to prevent property damage or injury.
- 7. <u>LOST AND FOUND</u>: During the event, Lost & Found will be at the OSAA Event Office or other location designated by the host facility / OSAA Staff. Beginning the first business day after the event, please email call 541.923.4653 to claim any missing items.
- 8. <u>COACHING</u>: In addition to the provisions of Rule 8-1, the Note under Rule 8 of the USGA Rules of Golf will be in effect. Each school may appoint one person (head coach, assistant coach, etc.) to give advice to, or ask for advice from, participants representing that school each day of the competition provided that
 - A. Only one person is appointed to give advice to, or ask for advice from, participants representing that school each day of the competition;
 - B. The person is identified to the games committee before the start of the competition each day;
 - C. The person does not give advice to, or ask for advice from, another school's participants or coaches;
 - D. The advice not be given during the playing of a hole but rather from the time a participant holes out on a hole until they tee off on the next hole (or during a suspension of play); and
 - E. The advice is given in a private manner and does not unduly delay play. **Penalty for breach of condition:** By a participant two strokes; By a coach two strokes will be added to the coach's school's score
 - F. The OSAA will have a sign-up sheet near the scoring area for each school to identify their designated coach each day. Designated coaches will be given a lanyard to wear for identification purposes.
- 9. SPECTATORS: Spectators must stay on cart paths or in the rough and at least 30 yards from any competitor during play. At no time should a spectator be on the green, on the tee, in a fairway, in a bunker, in a hazard, nor should they stand behind a player during his/her swing. Spectators may not communicate with participants from the time a player begins his/her round until his/her scorecard is handed in. Competitors may be penalized and / or disqualified if any person, other than the designated coach, assists the competitor by coaching and / or giving advice, which could influence a player in determining play, the choice of a club or method of making a stroke. Spectators may provide a participant with food, towels, umbrellas, rain suits, etc., during a round.
- **10.** <u>CELL PHONES / MOBILE DEVICES</u>: While cell phone use has become a part of everyday life, the OSAA believes that appropriate and considerate use of these devices is necessary during competition.
 - A. <u>Players</u>: Players shall not take cell phones / mobile devices on the courses for use of communication. If a player uses such a device at any point during his/her round, he/she may be subject to disqualification.
 - B. <u>Coaches and Spectators</u>: Cell phones must be set to vibrate or silent mode and shall not ring at any time while on the golf course. Cell phone conversations are prohibited at all times while on the golf course. If you need to take/make a call, please proceed to the clubhouse or parking lot. Thank you for being considerate of all participants and spectators.

11. **CARTS**:

- A. Motorized Carts Participants: Except as required by applicable law, participants may not use motorized golf carts in OSAA State Championships. The OSAA will evaluate, on a case-by-case basis, any request to use a motorized golf cart in OSAA State Championships due to a claimed disability. This request must be made in writing prior to the State Championship.
- B. <u>Motorized Carts Spectators</u>: Spectators, including coaches, may not use motorized golf carts at OSAA State Championships. The OSAA will evaluate, on a case-by-case basis, any request by a spectator to use a motorized golf cart at OSAA State Championships due to age or a disability. This request must be made in writing prior to the State Championships.
- C. <u>Pull Carts Participants</u>: Participants are allowed to use a pull cart in competition. Eagle Crest rents pull carts for \$6 per round. Please note that there are a limited number of pull carts available.
- 12. <u>RESTROOMS / WATER ON COURSE</u>: Eagle Crest Ridge Course has on-course restrooms near #4/#5, #10, #15/#16. Restrooms are also available in the clubhouse and near the practice putting green. Water coolers will be placed around the course every few holes near the tee box.
- **13. FOOD**: Eagle Crest Ridge Course has a snack bar in the clubhouse, which will open at 7am each day. Coaches are encouraged to order lunches for players at the start of each day to avoid having to wait in line with the general public.

- 14. AWARDS: All awards will be presented following the conclusion of each championship on Tuesday.
 - A. Trophies Champion through fourth place trophies will be awarded in each championship.
 - B. <u>Medals</u> Medals will be presented to the champion and second place teams in each championship. Medals will also be presented to the top ten individuals at each state championship who will be recognized as members of the U.S. Bank/Les Schwab Tires All-Tournament Team.
 - C. Moda Health Athlete of the Meet The medalist in each classification will be recognized as that classification's Moda Health Athlete of the Meet. In the event of a tie for medalist, multiple winners will be recognized. The winners will receive a certificate and commemorative gift from Moda Health the week following the championships. The certificate and gift will be mailed to the student's athletic director.
 - D. <u>Flags</u> The Oregon Golf Course Superintendents Association (OGCSA) has generously donated logo flags for use during each of this year's state championships. Their goal is to familiarize young golfers with the OGCSA and bring awareness to their role in the game today. The logo flags will be distributed to the top finishers at each of this year's state championships.
