SUBJECT: Summary of Executive Board Action at the February 12, 2018, Meeting

At the meeting on February 12, 2018, the OSAA Executive Board took the following actions:

- Voted to approve the minutes of the December 4, 2017, Executive Board meeting.
- Voted to add Board Policy – Out-of-State Schools Membership which details factors to consider for out-of-state schools seeking full membership, effective August 1, 2018. **(Attached)**
- Voted to table an amendment to Board Policy – Eligibility Appeals Board which would change the composition, meeting timeline and process of the Eligibility Appeals Board until May Executive Board Meeting. **(Attached)**
- Voted to forward an amendment to Rule 8.7 – Undue Influence which clarifies definitions and potential penalties for violation of the rule to the Delegate Assembly. Amendment to be placed on the April Delegate Assembly meeting agenda. **(Attached)**
- Voted to forward amended Article 6.2.4 (c) – Placement in a Lower Classification – Football Only to the Delegate Assembly for an e-mail vote later this month. **(Attached)**

Proposal to Add Board Policy – Out-of-State School Membership

(Action Item)

QUESTION: *Should the OSAA create a Board Policy that addresses the factors to consider for an out-of-state school seeking full membership?*

RATIONALE: Many states in our region have policies that address schools not within their state lines being part of their state association. There may be extenuating circumstances that warrant consideration of an out-of-state school joining the OSAA as a full member. The Delegate Assembly voted in October to enable the Executive Board to consider full membership by out-of-state schools that meet additional requirements set forth by the Board. These proposed requirements are similar to those that have been considered and/or adopted in Washington and Idaho. Additionally, these requirements could be used when considering a request from an in-state school to join another state.

Board Policy – Out-of-State School Membership

A high school in a bordering state may apply for full membership to the Association for consideration by the OSAA Executive Board. The application must be submitted not later than June 1 of the year one school year in advance of when the school seeks to join the Association and shall contain the following:

- A. A letter of support from the school's current state association.***
- B. A description of the significant travel hardship faced by the school that would be significantly improved with a change in state association membership. Including but not limited to: proximity of schools of similar size, impact on travel time, school district and student and parent participant funds, instructional time for students and teachers/coaches, safety of student participants and spectators, parents and other spectators, and school and other personnel.***
- C. Written input from the league/district/classification the school is leaving in their current association.***
- D. Written input from the league/district/classification the school is seeking to join.***
- E. Written commitment to adhere to all rules, regulations, and policies of the Association, plus any requirements of the school's current state department of education.***
- F. Written commitment to maintain membership in the Association for the entire 4-year time block; including all activities offered that mirror the Associations offerings.***
- G. Any additional information relating to the activity programs of the school and any other information that may assist the Association in considering the application.***

Continued membership of a bordering state shall be subject to review and renewal by the Executive Board prior to each quadrennial October Classification and Districting meeting.

Proposal to Amend Board Policy – Eligibility Appeals Board

(Action Item)

QUESTION: Should the Executive Board amend Board Policy – Eligibility Appeals Board to change the structure and process of Eligibility Appeals Board hearings?

RATIONALE: Member schools have requested changes to the current Eligibility Appeals Board policy at various times over the past year or so. The feedback has centered around perceived inconsistencies in the EAB’s decisions from one appeal to the next. A change in the structure and process of the hearings would provide greater consistency in rulings, provide greater insight into the rules and interpretations, and provide a timing structure that allows schools to plan.

Board Policy – Eligibility Appeals Board

- A. The Eligibility Appeals Board shall consist of ~~30~~ **15** members as follows:
 - 1) ~~Ten~~ **Five** school board members to be nominated by the Executive Director and approved by the Executive Board. ~~on a geographical basis selecting two from each of the five United States Congressional Districts.~~
 - 2) ~~Ten~~ **Five** school administrators (superintendents, assistant superintendents, principals, assistant principals, athletic directors) to be nominated by the Executive Director and approved by the Executive Board. ~~on a geographical basis selecting two from each of the five United States Congressional Districts.~~
 - 3) ~~Ten lay people to be nominated by the Executive Director and approved by the Executive Board on a geographical basis selecting two from each of the five United States Congressional Districts.~~ **Five current OSAA Executive Board Members to be nominated by the Executive Director and approved by the Executive Board.**
- B. The length of term shall be three years, and a person may not serve more than two **consecutive** terms. Initially, terms shall be staggered on a two-year, three-year basis within each group.
- C. The Eligibility Appeals Board shall hear any appeal filed by the involved school’s superintendent or principal, or the student’s parents regarding the District Committee’s ruling on the athletic eligibility transfer or discrimination hardship request.
- D. The Eligibility Appeals Board shall meet ~~when necessary~~ **monthly. If no appeals are submitted at least two (2) business days prior to that month’s meeting date, the Eligibility Appeals Board will not meet that month.**

- E. When a written appeal is received by the Executive Director, the Executive Director shall appoint ~~five~~ **three** members from the ~~30~~ **15** available members ~~to the~~ with not more than two members from each of the three groups making up the five-member Eligibility Appeals Board.
- 1) An Eligibility Appeals Board meeting is to be closed to the public unless the appealing party requests an open meeting.
 - 2) ***The student's previous school may designate a representative to testify at the Eligibility Appeals Board meeting.***
 - 3) Eligibility Appeals Board meetings may be held ***at the Association office in Wilsonville*** ~~in various areas of the state~~ or by telephone conference call, depending on the circumstances.
 - 4) The Executive Director, or an Assistant Executive Director, shall be present at all Eligibility Appeals Board meetings and shall process all requests for appeals to the Eligibility Appeals Board.
- F. A decision of the Eligibility Appeals Board may be appealed to a Hearings Officer under **Rule 9, "Hearings Officer."**

Proposal to Amend Rule 8.7 – Undue Influence

(Action Item)

QUESTION: *Should the Executive Board propose to the Delegate Assembly to amend Rule 8.7. – Undue Influence to better clarify the policy and potential penalties?*

RATIONALE: The Undue Influence rule has long been one of the least understood policies in the Handbook. Updating the rule to include clearer definitions and potential penalties will help to avoid confusion moving forward.

Rule 8.7 – Undue Influence

Rule: Despite compliance with the other provisions of these Rules, any student who attends a member high school as a result of undue influence, as defined in these Rules, is thereafter ineligible **for a minimum of one year** and the high school is subject to the penalties set out in **Rule 5. Violation of the Undue Influence Rule can also result in penalties to the school, athletic program, and ineligibility for a coach set out in Rule 5. The penalty and any additional period of ineligibility will be determined by the Executive Director based on a consideration of the number of violations involved, the number of student-athletes involved, the nature of the violation(s), the individual(s) responsible for the violation(s), and the extent to which the violation may have been knowing, deliberate, or in reckless disregard of the provisions of this rule and the commentary that accompanies this rule.**

For purposes of this Rule, "undue influence" is the attempt by any person (including but not limited to coaches, boosters, teachers, administrators, **students**, parents, alumni) to induce a student (**via in-person contact, phone, text, social media platforms, email, or the like**) to attend a public or private member school or become eligible to represent a public or private school for purposes of athletic or activities participation.

Undue influence includes, without limitation **but is not limited to, the offer or acceptance of:**

1. Recruiting the student to a particular school for purposes of athletic or activities participation.
2. **Financial assistance (including free or reduced tuition) provided on the basis of a student's potential or participation in OSAA-sanctioned activities.**
3. Promising employment or any other pecuniary **financial** benefit to the student or any member of the student's family to induce the attendance of the student at a particular school, **including payment for work that is not performed or that is in excess of the amount regularly paid for such service.**

4. *Free or reduced rent for families, including residence with any school connected person.*
5. *Transportation by any school connected person.*
6. *Any privilege not afforded to non-athletes.*
7. *Help in securing or promising a college athletic scholarship.*

It shall not be considered undue influence for authorized representatives of a private high school to contact students attending private feeder schools to induce their attendance at the private high school or for authorized representatives of public high schools to so contact students within that public high school's attendance boundaries.

Rationale: The objective of the Undue Influence rule is to prevent member schools, and persons affiliated with a member school, from exerting an undue influence on students with a goal of securing or retaining a student for athletic or activities purposes. This rule serves the substantial interests of Association members of prioritizing academics over competition, protecting young students from exploitation, ensuring an even playing field among competing schools, providing for equitable competition in Association sports and activities, and protecting the physical welfare of students engaging in contact sports.

Proposal to Add Article 6.2.4. (c) – Classification of Schools, Placement in a Lower Classification – Football Only

(Action Item)

QUESTION: Should the Executive Board propose to the Delegate Assembly to add Article 6.2.4. (c) – Classification of Schools, Placement in a Lower Classification – Football Only based on recommendations from the Football Ad Hoc Committee?

RATIONALE: The Executive Board formed a Football Ad Hoc Committee in September 2017 based upon a recommendation from the Classification and Districting Committee and OSAA staff. The Football Ad Hoc Committee has met six times and is working to address concerns regarding the sport of football throughout our state. One of their recommendations involves criteria that would allow schools to be eligible for placement in a lower classification, in football only, based on the number of in-classification contests and a team’s winning percentage in those contests. The details of the criteria are outlined in Board Policy – Placement in a Lower Classification but the recommendation necessitates adding language to the OSAA’s Constitution regarding classification of schools.

Article 6.2.4 (c) – Assignment to a Lower Classification – Football Only

6.2.4. Classification of Schools – Classification Thresholds. During the four-year time block, the following Average Daily Membership (ADM) thresholds will be used by the Executive Board when considering school placement or classification changes:

- 6A: 1258 or more 4A: 331 to 675 2A: 90 to 190
5A: 676 to 1257 3A: 191 to 330 1A: 10 to 89

EXCEPTION: OSAA member schools shall participate based upon ADM in the classifications defined in this Article unless an exception has been granted by the Executive Board in response to the submission of a Petition to Play Down, or to a Petition to Play Up, or Placement in a Lower Classification.

(a) Petition to Play Down. (Petition to Play Down)

- (1) Submission Deadline. Except as specified in Article 6.2.2 (c), a member school seeking to play in a lower classification than assigned under Article 6.2.4 shall be required to complete and submit a “Petition to Play Down” to the OSAA prior to June 1 preceding the quadrennial October Classification and Districting Meeting.
(2) Sports and Activities Affected. Any “Petition to Play Down” granted by the Executive Board shall apply to all OSAA sports and activities in which the member school participates.
(3) Duration. Any “Petition to Play Down” granted by the Executive Board shall apply to the classification placement of the petitioning member school during the entire subsequent four-year time block.

- (4) **Required Information.** A member school submitting a “Petition to Play Down” shall provide the following information for consideration by the Executive Board. Petitioning schools that meet all four criteria listed below shall be automatically approved. Schools meeting some but not all criteria will have their petition reviewed by the Executive Board:
- a) Documentation showing the school’s percentage of students on free lunch at 50% or higher.
 - b) Documentation showing that the school’s teams finished in the bottom 50% of the final frozen rankings at their current classification at least 75% of the time for the previous three years.
 - c) Documentation showing that the school’s teams finished in the bottom 20% of the final frozen rankings at their current classification at least 50% of the time for the previous three years.
 - d) Documentation showing that the winning percentage for the school’s teams in team sports was 25% or less at least 40% of the time for the previous three years.
- (5) **Additional Information.** A member school submitting a “Petition to Play Down” may provide any other information to the Executive Board in support of the petition including, but not limited to, evidence of intervention undertaken by the district in an effort to encourage address lack of competitive success and a letter of current league support for the “Petition to Play Down.”
- (b) **Petition to Play Up.** [\(Petition to Play Up\)](#)
- (1) **Submission Deadline.** A member school seeking to play in a higher classification than assigned under [Article 6.2.4](#) shall be required to complete and submit a “Petition to Play Up” to the OSAA prior to June 1 preceding the quadrennial October Classification and Districting Meeting.
 - (2) **Sports and Activities Affected.** Any “Petition to Play Up” granted by the Executive Board shall apply to all OSAA sports and activities in which the member school participates.
 - (3) **Duration.** Any “Petition to Play Up” granted by the Executive Board shall apply to the classification placement of the petitioning member school during the entire subsequent four-year time block. See [Executive Board Policies, “Classification – Playing Up”](#) for additional information.
- (c) **Placement in a Lower Classification – Football Only.** See [Executive Board Policies, “Football – Placement in a Lower Classification”](#) for additional information.
- (1) **Deadline.** *A member school that meets a criterion to be eligible for placement in a lower classification than its adjusted base number enrollment dictates shall notify the OSAA if it intends to accept that placement per the deadline established by the Executive Board.*
 - (2) **Sports and Activities Affected.** *Any “Placement in a Lower Classification” approved by the Executive Board shall apply to football only.*
 - (3) **Duration.** *Any “Placement in a Lower Classification” approved by the Executive Board shall apply for two years.*
 - (4) **Placement Range.** *A member school shall not be placed more than one classification lower than the classification where it accumulated the data used to meet a criterion.*
 - (5) **Eligibility.** *A member school approved by the Executive Board for “Placement in a Lower Classification” shall be eligible for district or state honors at the lower classification.*

Proposal to Amend Article 6.4. – Competing Outside the Assigned Classification
(Action Item)

QUESTION: *Should the Executive Board propose to the Delegate Assembly to amend Article 6.4. – Competing Outside the Assigned Classification based on recommendations from the Football Ad Hoc Committee?*

RATIONALE: The Executive Board formed a Football Ad Hoc Committee in September 2017 based upon a recommendation from the Classification and Districting Committee and OSAA staff. The Football Ad Hoc Committee has met six times and is working to address concerns regarding the sport of football throughout our state. One of their recommendations involves criteria that would allow schools to be eligible for placement in a lower classification, in football only, based on the number of in-classification contests and a team’s winning percentage in those contests. The details of the criteria are outlined in Board Policy – Placement in a Lower Classification but the recommendation necessitates amending language to the OSAA’s Constitution regarding competing outside the assigned classification.

Article 6.4 – Competing Outside the Assigned Classification

A school may choose to compete outside its assigned classification in any sport but will not be eligible for district or state honors outside its assigned classification in that sport, ***except as otherwise provided in 6.2.4. (c).***

Proposal to Add Board Policy – Football – Placement in a Lower Classification

QUESTION: *Should the Executive Board add Board Policy – Football – Placement in a Lower Classification based on recommendations from the Football Ad Hoc Committee?*

RATIONALE: The Executive Board formed a Football Ad Hoc Committee in September 2017 based upon a recommendation from the Classification and Districting Committee and OSAA staff. The Football Ad Hoc Committee has met six times and is working to address concerns regarding the sport of football throughout our state. One of their recommendations involves criteria that would allow schools to be eligible for placement in a lower classification, in football only, based on the number of in-classification contests and a team's winning percentage in those contests over the previous years. The details of the criteria are outlined in this proposed Board Policy.

Board Policy – Football – Placement in a Lower Classification

- A. **Eligibility.** *For a member school to be eligible for initial placement in a lower classification as permitted in Article 6.2.4. (c), the school must meet at least one of the following criterion:*
- 1) **Winning Percentage – Four-Year.** *The school's in-classification winning percentage (Colley) in football for the previous four years shall be 22% or lower.*
 - 2) **Winning Percentage – Two-Year.** *The school's in-classification winning percentage (Colley) in football for the previous two years shall be 22% or lower.*
 - 3) **Number of In-Classification Games.** *The school played twelve or fewer in-classification games in football during the previous four years.*
 - 4) **Enrollment Zone – 11-Man vs. 8-Man.** *The school's adjusted base number enrollment is between 90 and 120, and the school intends to play 8-man football.*
- B. **Deadline.** *A member school that meets one of the above criterion shall notify the OSAA of its intent to accept placement in a lower classification prior to January 15 of each even-numbered year beginning in 2018.*
- C. **Duration of Placement.** *Approval of placement in a lower classification shall apply for two years.*
- D. **Cooperative Sponsorships.** *Schools involved in a cooperative sponsorship that participated together during the previous two-year or four-year period that also meet one of the above criteria are eligible for placement in a lower classification. Newly formed cooperative sponsorships shall be subject to Board Policy – Cooperative Sponsorship.*
- E. **Two-Year Evaluation.** *Following two years of placement in a lower classification, a school shall be evaluated to determine if the school should change classifications again. The evaluation shall include, but is not limited to, the following criteria: in-classification winning percentage (Colley), league finish, playoff appearances/finish, program participation numbers, and adjusted base number enrollment.*

SUBJECT: OSAA State Championship Committee – January 22 Meeting Update
Revised with Executive Board Adoptions from February 12 Meeting

The State Championship Committee for the 2018-2022 four-year time block held its final of eight public meetings at the OSAA office in Wilsonville on January 22, 2018. The constitutionally mandated purpose of this Committee is to make recommendations to the OSAA Executive Board for adoption in February 2018, regarding championship formats, participation policies and issues relative to the administration of OSAA State Championships.

The Committee received testimony from 10 individuals addressing specific areas of state championship structures in the activities of speech and debate, baseball, cross country, golf, track and field, and wrestling. While they considered each proposal, and had extensive discussion in relations to them, some were not supported for various reasons (format, cost to association, cost to schools, feasibility, etc.).

The Committee discussed and is currently supportive of these items for state championships beginning in the 2018-19 school year:

- **Playoff Reimbursement Formula**
 1. **Adding three additional levels of reimbursement which will be at the mileage levels of 801-900, 901-1000, 1000 and above.**
 2. **Eliminating per diem reimbursement for roundtrip mileage of 151-200.**

NOTE: The State Championship Committee recognizes that additional changes to the Playoff Reimbursement Formula may be considered by the Executive Board, especially as they consider recommendations by the Football Ad Hoc Committee.
- **Continuation of the better ranked team hosting and not going to neutral sites in the semifinal rounds of soccer, baseball and softball.**
- **Basketball Final Site Formats at all Classification Levels – Committee unanimously supports schedule changes that will place same gender in the same session at all final sites, as is currently formatted at the 6A championship.**
- **The use of non-local officials for baseball and softball beginning in the semifinals.**

The Committee discussed and is currently not supportive of these items:

- **Adjustment of the OSAA calendar that would allow winter sports to begin practice on an earlier date. This recommendation was made by the Oregon Basketball Coaches Association stating a desire for a longer try-out period, longer time to work on fundamentals, more time to prepare students for competition, along with various other reasons. After a lengthy discussion, the Committee voted to support the current calendar structure because of the domino effect that this change would have on other seasons. While winter sports do have major holidays that fall early in their season, and they have the longest season, they do have 16 days of practice prior to competition compared to fall (10) and spring (14).**
- **The addition of 2 players in soccer and volleyball for OSAA post-season play.**
- **Format change in baseball that would include a double elimination tournament, beginning in the quarterfinals for 6A, 5A, 4A and the semifinals for 3A and 2A/1A. While the Committee understands the concern with pitching limitations, the use of a double elimination bracket is not used in any other OSAA team sport championship.**

SUBJECT: OSAA Football Ad Hoc Advisory Committee Update
Revised with Executive Board Adoptions from February 12 meeting

The Football Ad Hoc Committee conducted its fourth public meeting on January 31, 2018 at the OSAA Office in Wilsonville. Committee recommendations will be forwarded to the OSAA Executive Board for review and potential adoption on February 12, 2018.

OSAA staff provided a summary of 33 pieces of correspondence received after the last meeting. The Committee received testimony from individuals representing 10 different schools. The group then convened into a work session to discuss strategies to address the observations/issues list outlined in their January 8 update.

At this point the group has reached consensus on the following recommendations:

- Using criteria to identify teams eligible to play down a classification for a 2-year period. Any team meeting one of the following criterion would become eligible to play down:
 - Any team with a four-year Colley winning percentage of 22% or lower or separate has played 12 or fewer in-classification games during the last four years.
 - Any team with a two-year Colley winning percentage of 22% or lower.A complete listing of teams meeting these criteria and their status for the 2018 season is included within this update.
- Creation of an enrollment zone between the 2A and 1A. Any school with adjusted enrollment between 90 and 120 would have the option to participate in 11-man or 8-man Football.
- Allowing variations in game formats (i.e. 1, 2, or 3 quarter games) at the sub-varsity level to provide needed flexibility for some programs when creating sub-varsity participation opportunities.
- Codifying modifications to NFHS Football playing rules at the sub-varsity level (i.e. no kicking game, no blitzing, etc.) and making sure that all schools are aware of potential options moving forward.
- Recommending that sub-varsity scheduling be separated from varsity scheduling in order to enable schools to better match teams competitively with an emphasis on local geographic play.
- Piloting 6-man Football for the 2018 and 2019 seasons. Any school with an adjusted enrollment of 89 or less would be allowed to participate in the pilot. During the pilot, no OSAA Championship will be awarded at the 6-man level.

The group tabled discussion regarding developing the criteria that would be used to determine how a school who has played down, be moved back up. There is agreement within the group that this criteria should include evaluation of the following over the two-year period:

- Colley winning percentage
- League finish
- Playoff appearances
- Participation numbers
- Enrollment figures

The Committee’s expectation is that administrators at member schools work together to accommodate the scheduling needs of all schools regardless of geographic location. Geographically isolated schools/leagues need to have primary consideration when filling non-league schedules. Member schools need to share the travel burden to these schools to minimize the number of out-of-state contests and eliminate as many open dates as possible for as many schools as possible in any given year.

The Committee is also in agreement that moving forward all classifications attempt to be as consistent as possible in determining scheduling dates for sub-varsity contests. Consistent dates allow schools more flexibility to pair like opponents. Currently some leagues have selected Thursday for sub-varsity games and others have selected Monday which leads to inevitable scheduling problems when schools from leagues with different philosophies are paired to play. The group requested that OSAA staff survey the schools to determine which option schools are currently planning on implementing.

The group encourages leagues to develop systems that allow teams to play at least 1 game outside of their assigned Special District/League. Closed systems (all games within a single special district) may not allow the opportunity to compare teams as well as systems in which teams from a variety of placements participate against one another. If member schools want the adopted rankings system to perform most effectively then playing a variety of opponents outside of your league is a positive step in that direction.

Member schools involved in cooperative sponsorships in football was discussed at length. Ultimately, the group reached consensus that schools involved in a cooperative sponsorship that participated together during the previous two-year or four-year period that also meet one of the established criteria are eligible for placement in a lower classification. Newly formed cooperative sponsorship shall be subject to Board Policy – Cooperative Sponsorships.

The Committee is currently supporting the following playoff qualification numbers and allocation methods for each classification. The proposed alignments included with the January 8 Meeting update have been revised based on decisions made by schools identified as having the option to play down and input from various classification representatives and correspondence. Reference the proposed alignments to match-up the various classification options listed below.

Classification	Qualifiers	Allocation Method
6A	32	3 teams per SD plus 11 via rankings
5A	16	SD1 – 6 teams, SD2 – 5 teams, SD3 – 5 teams
4A	16	2-teams in each SD plus 4 added via play-in model
3A	16	SD1 – 6 teams, SD2 – 6 teams, and SD3 – 3 teams plus 1 via rankings
2A	16	2 teams per SD plus 4 via rankings
1A	16	SD1 – 4 teams, SD2 – 4 teams, SD3 – 4/5 teams plus 3/4 via rankings. Note: Allocations to be determined yearly at the Sept. Executive Board Meeting.

When the Committee is reconvened, the following topics will be addressed:

- Strategies to address declining participation numbers
- Strategies to address declining number of game officials
- Role of the OSAA and member schools as related to youth football
- Defining allowable NFHS rule variations at the sub-varsity level
- Reviewing coaching certification requirements – USA Football

The OSAA staff will provide a Committee update, like this one, to all superintendents, principals, athletic directors, and football coaches following each meeting. The Committee roster, charge, and any additional committee information is available at <http://www.osaa.org/governance/committees>.

SUBJECT: Inclusion Committee – January 11 Meeting Minutes

The OSAA Inclusion Committee met for the first time this school year in a closed work session on Thursday, January 11 at the OSAA Offices in Wilsonville. In person attendees included Ken Bell (Sherwood HS), Ted Yates (Gladstone HS), Heidi Hermansen (Cascade HS), Kacey McCallister (World Wheelchair Sports) along with OSAA Staff members Peter Weber, Brad Garrett, Kris Welch and Kelly Foster. Committee members Ian Jaquiss (OHSU) and Carly Schmidt (City of Eugene) were able to join via teleconference.

The meeting began with introductions and a recap of the June 2017 meeting. The primary focus was to review the recommendations that were forwarded to the OSAA Executive Board and how those were received and will be implemented in the 2018 championships.

The OSAA Executive Board approved adding the shot put and the 1500-meter race to the offerings at the 2018 Track and Field State Championships with the note that para-athletes are allowed to participate in two of the four events offered (100-meter, 400-meter, 1500-meter, shot put). The OSAA staff is working with the Hytek software to investigate the options of creating events for the program but also placing students under their school information. Currently used scoring systems to say in place.

The Committee is cognizant that including shot put into the offerings brings in additional equipment and knowledge to administer the event. The Committee agrees that those students who wish to participate in the para-athlete shot put will have to organize all necessary equipment needed to throw through supportive entities or their school. Responsibility to have said equipment will not be with local schools hosting local or district meets. The OSAA staff is reviewing with Hayward Field what would be appropriate for the state track meet; some equipment may be supplied by the OSAA.

The 2018 Swimming State Championship will see limited change except for the review of the Hytek software and its ability to be modified to accommodate the different races, classifications and scoring for the events. Scoring systems will be modified based on the number of competitors.

The OSAA staff will continue to review the championships and placement of para-athlete events within the event. With the events being across classifications, the staff will try to put the events in the best place possible for visibility and event dynamics. At Track and Field, due to the structure of the event, all para-athlete events will need to take place prior to the trophy ceremony for the 3A, 2A and 1A schools.

The Inclusion Committee's focus has now turned to coach education and getting more students to participate in these events throughout the year. The OSAA staff will work closely with World Wheelchair Sports, Adaptive Sports Northwest and the NFHS to obtain, post and promote information that pertains to recruiting and coaching student athletes in their Swimming and/or Track and Field programs. The Committee feels that communicating information to schools will be

the best way to increase the number of students in the events. The Inclusion Committee will reach out to outside organizations (Oregon Athletic Coaches, Oregon Athletic Directors, and large outside events) to promote para-athlete inclusion.

The OSAA received a request from a school requesting the opportunity for a student-athletes to qualify for the state meet at a national event taking place on the same weekend as their district meet. The Committee discussed at length but came to the conclusion that each para athletes at the state meet would have to qualify in the same manner as all other students. The Committee is reviewing what other states do in regard to these limited national events but at this time all students must participate and qualify through their district meet.

The Committee continues to support that the para-athletes need to be academically eligible and participate with their team throughout the year.

The Committee will schedule their next meeting for the week of May 28, 2018 with that meeting being open to the public.

The OSAA Rankings Committee met on January 17 at the OSAA Office for the first time this school year to continue its review of the rankings, and in particular the Fall 2017 season.

The Committee has set dates for two upcoming public meetings. Both meetings will have public testimony where written correspondence will also be reviewed. Following its June meeting, the Committee will forward its final recommendations to the OSAA Executive Board for a vote at the Board's Summer Workshop, July 23-25, 2018.

New members of the Committee were introduced and welcomed:

The Committee began by going over the history of the rankings process then started reviewing Fall 2017 brackets, rankings, and final 8, along with written correspondence received since their last meeting. Following this review, the Committee examined rankings scenarios and correlation studies of former and current systems, along with several different percentage breakdowns, 2-column vs. 3-column approaches, etc.

Correlation Studies: Correlation studies are produced by OSAA staff and serve as one way to gauge the "accuracy" of the system. What counts as "accurate" regarding a rankings system is certainly open to interpretation but Committee members believe there is value associated with this information, especially when looking at making possible changes.

Changing the Colley Rank to Include Contests One Classification Away: Committee members believe that changing the Colley to include out of classification contests one classification away may help with the perception of teams not wanting to hurt their ranking by scheduling other classifications. Working with Dan Smith of OregonPrep Sports, the OSAA is running simulations using data from previous seasons to see what type of impact may result. The group will review these simulations at their April meeting. ***The Committee is interested in receiving feedback on this concept prior to its April 3 meeting***

League Playoffs / District Tournaments

The Committee discussed the real, and perceived, advantages for leagues that conduct league playoffs and having those contests included in the rankings. The group asked the OSAA staff to run simulations to determine how much of an impact it would have on the overall rankings if these games were not counted in the rankings. The group will review these simulations at their April meeting. ***The Committee is interested in receiving feedback on this concept prior to its April 3 meeting***

Home/Away/Neutral Weighting of Contests

The Committee discussed the weighting of home/away/neutral sites and asked the OSAA staff to run simulations on different weighting to determine the potential impact. This was specifically brought up in reference to baseball/softball games where that weighting is determined by who bats first, rather than by location. The group will review these simulations at their April meeting. ***The Committee is interested in receiving feedback on this concept prior to its April 3 meeting***

Ties in Soccer

The Committee received correspondence concerning the discrepancy in the number of ties in soccer and its impact on the rankings. The correspondence referenced the number of upsets in the first round of the state playoffs and believes that this could be an effect of an inflated value for ties. The group asked the staff to run simulations with differing values to determine its impact on the rankings. The group will review these simulations at their April meeting. ***The Committee is interested in receiving feedback on this concept prior to its April 3 meeting***

Requiring a Minimum Number of Rankable Contests in Football

An issue that came up this past Fall in Football was discussed concerning teams playing a limited number of rankable games and the significant impact that has on their ranking, and the ranking of those teams they've played. This becomes more pronounced when teams play mixed 11-man and 8-man schedules where not all games are rankable. The OSAA staff will review data to bring back to the group at their April meeting looking at what makes logical sense as a minimum number. ***The Committee is interested in receiving feedback on this concept prior to its April 3 meeting***

SUBJECT: OSAA Officials Recruitment and Retention Committee Update

The Officials Recruitment and Retention Committee conducted their first public meeting of the 2017-18 year on January, 24, 2017 at the OSAA Office in Wilsonville. The purpose of this Committee is to make recommendations to the OSAA Executive Board related to increasing the total number of registered game officials and improving retention rates.

The group received testimony from two individuals and then convened to a work session to discuss and finalize recommendations.

During the work session the group discussed and reconfirmed the desire to continue to support each of the following items with items as noted:

1. The Committee feels strongly that using targeted social media more proficiently is important as we move into the future. The OAOA is encouraged to develop a partnership with Capital Community Television (CCTV) in Salem to produce video segments/snippets that can be used for recruitment and retention efforts, training of officials, and other types of promotional video that can be integrated into website and social media platforms.
2. The Committee is encouraged to see that the OAOA will be conducting a summer workshop in June with all Commissioners and the OSAA staff. Continued opportunities to develop leadership at the local levels is critical moving forward and the group encourages organizers to consider dedicating some time to addressing recruitment and retention of officials in the future.
3. Data reveals that an official who has been mentored is much more likely to stay involved. Many local associations have some form of mentorship program in place but these programs range from mandated participation to loosely organized. The Committee has reached consensus that all local associations should have some form of mentorship program in place to begin the 2018-19 school year. The group is currently reviewing a variety of different model templates to make available to locals for review, consideration, and potential adoption.
4. The Committee received an update from the OSAA Sportsmanship Committee related to their efforts to address unsportsmanlike behavior. This Committee is taking steps to better define the roles and responsibilities of school administrators when participating in OSAA sanctioned contests. Given the negative impact of unsportsmanlike conduct by coaches, participants, and spectators on official's recruitment and retention it is imperative that school administrators understand the expectations in this area, those expectations be clearly defined, and that unsportsmanlike conduct by any person be addressed immediately and consistently.
5. OSAA and WIAA staff have recently met and agreed that working together on the issue of recruitment and retention of officials is in the best interest of both Associations as we move into the future. The concept of convening a mixed Committee structure with representatives from the OSAA, WIAA, WOA, and OAOA has

been discussed and has potential as we move forward.

6. The Committee continues to support finding ways to incentivize the process of recruiting and retaining officials. No specifics were discussed at length but this topic remains open and shows real potential as one method to spark local association memberships to reach out to those whom they know may be interested in officiating.

The OSAA staff will provide a Committee update, like this one, to all official's associations, superintendents, principals, and athletic directors following each meeting.
