4. **PARKING:** In order to make sure that schools are able to park near the clubhouse, the OSAA will provide two parking passes for the main lot to each school with a qualifying team. Schools with qualifying individuals will receive one pass. A parking pass will be required to park in the main lot during the championships. All other vehicles will be directed to the overflow lot near Electric Road or near the OSU Crew Docks. **NOTE: Passes will be distributed at the Sunday night coaches meeting.**
5. **SPECTATOR CONDUCT AT OSAA SANCTIONED EVENTS** (*OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies*) (*Revised Fall 2009*): "In addition to the general expectations included in the OSAA Constitution, Rule 3, that school officials "...shall take all reasonable measures to ensure that the school's students and supporters maintain a sportsmanlike attitude toward all events..." the following specific expectations regarding spectator conduct at all OSAA sanctioned events, including regular and post season competition, are provided:
  - A. All cheers, comments and actions shall be in direct support of one's team. No cheers, comments or actions shall be directed at one's opponent or at contest officials. Some examples of inappropriate conduct or actions that are not permitted are: turning backs, holding up newspapers or jeering at cheerleaders during opposing team introductions; disrespecting players by name, number or position; negative cheers or chants; throwing objects on the floor.
  - B. Spectators are not permitted to have signs or banners (larger than 8 ½ by 11 inches), confetti, balloons or glass containers. Spectators are required to wear shirts.
  - C. Spectators are not permitted to have artificial noisemakers. Some examples of artificial noisemakers are Thunder Stix, cowbells, clappers and air horns.
  - D. Spectators shall not be permitted to use vulgar/offensive or racially/culturally insensitive language. Spectators shall not be permitted to engage in any racially / culturally insensitive action.
  - E. Spectators who fail to comply with Association or site management spectator conduct expectations may be expelled from the contest."

6. **CHEMICAL HEALTH POSITION** (*Excerpt OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies*) (Revised Fall 2004):

- C. The OSAA abides by all state laws and district policies pertaining to the use of tobacco, alcohol and illegal drugs. As a general rule, OSAA activities' sites shall be alcohol and tobacco free during OSAA events. All persons in attendance shall refrain from use of tobacco, alcohol and illegal drugs at all OSAA activities and are prohibited from being under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs at all event facilities.

### **PRE-STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS**

1. **QUALIFICATION FOR STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS** (*excerpt from 2014 OSAA Golf Plan*)

d. **4A/3A/2A/1A Girls:**

- 1) Qualifiers – The top 2 teams and top 5 individuals from each league/district. If any of the top 5 individual qualifiers are members of qualifying teams, no additional individuals will qualify.
- 2) Ties – Any ties for final team or individual qualification spots shall be broken by the district prior to submitting the official state championship entry to the OSAA.

e. **3A/2A/1A Boys:**

- 1) Qualifiers – The top 2 teams and top 5 individuals from each league/district. If any of the top 5 individual qualifiers are members of qualifying teams, no additional individuals will qualify.
- 2) Ties – Any ties for final team or individual qualification spots shall be broken by the district prior to submitting the official state championship entry to the OSAA.

2. **POSTING TIMELINE:**

Tee times for team and individual qualifiers will be posted on the OSAA website by 6pm on Wednesday, May 14.

- b. District Meet Directors AND coaches of qualifying teams and individuals are responsible for checking the accuracy of the entry information. Please check your entries for correct spelling of participant's name, year in school, and school name, as this information *will appear the same way on the score cards, score sheets, and in the championship results unless corrected.*

4. **STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – INDIVIDUAL SPORT SUBSTITUTIONS** (*OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies*)(**Revised Fall 2013**):

- A. "The following shall be the policy for substitutions in individual sport State Championship events. **All individuals who are substitutes for individual qualifiers must have participated in a District or Special District Meet.**

B. Golf

- 1) Individuals: If an individual qualifier drops out of the state championship by 4pm two business days (**Thursday, May 15**) prior to the state championship, the district may substitute the next eligible individual qualifier not a member of a qualifying team.
  - a) The district must notify the OSAA office of any such substitution by 4pm two business days (**Thursday, May 15**) prior to the state championship.
- 2) Team: Substitutions on qualified teams may be made up to one hour prior to the start of each round of the state championship. A team may enter a maximum of five participants with its top four finishers counting toward team standings.

## STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

### 1. CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT:

- a. The State Championships will be a two-day 36-hole event. Play will commence each day at 7:30am (4A/3A/2A/1A Girls) and 12:15pm (3A/2A/1A Boys).
- b. **Team Competition:** A school entering a team of four or five players will be competing for the team championship. A school with less than four scores will not be considered a part of the team competition. Team scores shall be determined by adding a team's four best individual scores on the first day of play to a team's four best individual scores on the second day of play. In the event of a tie for first place at the end of the second round, the team with the lower 5<sup>th</sup> score from Tuesday's round will be declared the champion. If the teams are still tied at that point, the team with the lower 5<sup>th</sup> score from Monday's round will be declared the champion. If the teams are still tied, the teams will be declared co-champions. Ties for places other than first will not be broken.
- c. **Individual Competition:** All players in the State Championships may compete for individual honors. Ties for individual honors will not be broken.

2. **PAIRINGS / TEE TIMES:** First round pairings / tee times are rotated annually by the OSAA and will be posted to the OSAA website by 6pm on Wednesday, May 14. Second round pairings / tee times will be posted to the OSAA website following play on Monday. Pairings for the second round will be based on first round scores with Monday's team leaders going off the #1 tee last. All 4A/3A/2A/1A Girls tee times for both days will be between 7:30am and 9:20am. All 3A/2A/1A Boys tee times for both days will be between 12:15pm and 2:05pm. (see attached Tuesday pairings guide for details)
3. **TIME OF STARTING AND GROUPS (RULE 6-3):** If the player arrives at his/her starting point, ready to play, within five minutes after his/her starting time, in the absence of circumstances that warrant waiving the penalty of disqualification as provided in Rule 33-7, the penalty for failure to start on time is loss of two strokes at the first hole in stroke play instead of disqualification. Penalty for lateness beyond five minutes is disqualification.
4. **COACHES' MEETING:** There will be a coaches' meeting at 7pm on Sunday, May 18 at Trysting Tree Golf Club. The meeting will take place in the scoring area near the snack bar and all coaches are encouraged to attend.
5. **SCHOOL ASSIGNMENTS:** Schools are no longer being assigned to spots on the course during the State Championships. However, the OSAA is encouraging coaches to help in spotting balls and assist in maintaining pace of play while they are out on the course following their team members. Coaches should not make any rulings but can help to track down a member of the Rules Committee if needed.
6. **PRACTICE ROUNDS: NOTE: Coaches will not be allowed to play during the assigned practice rounds as there are only enough times to accommodate participating players. Coaches are encouraged to walk the course with their players.** Trysting Tree has blocked out tee times on Saturday and Sunday, May 17-18 for practice rounds by participating players. Participants will each be charged \$13 for this practice round. At the request of Trysting Tree, qualifying teams and individuals will be assigned practice round times by the OSAA. (Please see the attached Practice Round Tee Time Guide for general times.) Once qualifying teams and individuals are known, the OSAA will post a final list to the OSAA website. Range balls will be available for purchase during practice rounds. Cost is \$2 per range token. Qualifying teams and individuals are allowed to play additional practice rounds at Trysting Tree prior to the State Championship. Contact Trysting Tree for rates and availability.
7. **ATTIRE:** All participants must be properly dressed for practice rounds and the State Championship.  
**Boys:** No jeans, denim slacks, gym sweats, or T-shirts. Walking shorts must be mid-thigh length. Sport caps must be worn bill forward. Shirts with collars, turtleneck, or mock turtleneck only. **Soft spikes are required at Trysting Tree Golf Club.**  
**Girls:** No jeans, denim slacks, gym sweats, or T-shirts. Walking shorts must be mid-thigh length. Sport caps must be worn bill forward. Halter tops, tanks tops, bare midriff, tube tops, or shirts with spaghetti straps are prohibited. **Soft spikes are required at Trysting Tree Golf Club.**
8. **FROST DELAY PROCEDURE:** Please contact Trysting Tree Golf Club (541.752.3332) beginning at 6:15am on Monday or Tuesday if due to weather conditions a frost delay is possible.
9. **RANGE BALLS:** Range balls will be provided free of charge on Monday and Tuesday prior to the start of a player's round. Coaches only will be able to get tokens from the pro shop. The range will open at 6:30am. Only players participating in the State Championship should be using the range during this time.
10. **HOLE LOCATION / LOCAL RULES SHEETS:** Each player will receive a copy of that day's hole locations along with the Local Rules sheet for the State Championship on his / her first tee on both Monday and Tuesday. (see attached local rules sheet for more information)

11. **SUMMER RULES:** Summer rules will be used at the State Championships. In the event of inclement weather/course conditions, the OSAA, in conjunction with the Rules Committee and the course professional, may authorize the Cleaning Ball Local Rule.
12. **YARDAGE / TEE MARKERS:** Trysting Tree has marked on sprinkler heads and discs on each hole. The discs are orange (250), blue (200 yards), white (150 yards), and red (100 yards). All yardage is to the center of the green. All boys players will use the BLUE tee markers, all of the girls players will use the RED tee markers during both rounds of the championship. (See attached sample scorecards for this year's course yardage.) All other tee markers will be removed to avoid confusion.
13. **RANGEFINDERS and other ELECTRONIC DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES:** Per Rule 14-3, the OSAA prohibits the use of any artificial device or unusual equipment during a competitive round for the purpose of gauging or measuring distance or conditions. These devices are allowed during practice rounds.
14. **COACHING:** In addition to the provisions of Rule 8-1, the Note under Rule 8 of the USGA Rules of Golf will be in effect. Thus, each school may appoint one person (head coach, assistant coach, etc.) to give advice to, or ask for advice from, participants representing that school each day of the competition provided that:
  - a. Only one person is appointed to give advice to, or ask for advice from, participants representing that school each day of the competition;
  - b. The person is identified to the games committee before the start of the competition each day;
  - c. The person does not give advice to, or ask for advice from, another school's participants or coaches;
  - d. The advice not be given during the playing of a hole but rather from the time a participant holes out on a hole until they tee off on the next hole (or during a suspension of play); and
  - e. The advice is given in a private manner and does not unduly delay play.

**Penalty for breach of condition:** By a participant – two strokes; By a coach – two strokes will be added to the coach's school's score

The OSAA will have a sign-up sheet near the scoring area for each school to identify their designated coach each day. Designated coaches will be given a lanyard to wear for identification purposes.

15. **SPECTATORS:** Spectators must stay on cart paths or in the rough and at least 30 yards from any competitor during play. At no time should a spectator be on the green, on the tee, in a fairway, in a bunker, in a hazard, nor should they stand behind a player during his/her swing. Spectators may not communicate with participants from the time a player begins his/her round until his/her scorecard is handed in. Competitors may be penalized and / or disqualified if any person, other than the designated coach, assists the competitor by coaching and / or giving advice, which could influence a player in determining play, the choice of a club or method of making a stroke. Spectators may provide a participant with food, towels, umbrellas, rain suits, etc., during a round.
16. **GOLF BALLS / GOLF CLUBS:** The ball each competitor uses must be named on the current List of Conforming Golf Balls issued by the USGA. Each competitor is strongly encouraged to put an identifying mark on his / her ball. The one ball rule is not in effect at the State Championships. Golf clubs listed on the current USGA List of Non-Conforming Driving Clubs may not be used or carried; penalty is disqualification.
17. **SCORING PROCEDURE:** Competitors will receive a scorecard on his / her first tee each day of the competition. Scorecards will be exchanged with another competitor from the group. Each competitor (marker) will be responsible for keeping score for another competitor in the group. After each hole, the marker should check the score with the competitor and record it. Players are asked to bring scorecards to the scoring area at the turn. Scores at the turn are unofficial.

At the conclusion of the round, the entire group should proceed immediately to the scoring area. The marker should sign the scorecard and hand it to the competitor. Competitors are to review their scorecard thoroughly for the accuracy of the hole-by-hole score and settle any doubtful points with the Rules Committee. The competitor is responsible for the correctness of the score recorded for each hole on his/her scorecard. If he/she returns a score for any hole lower than actually taken, he/she is disqualified. If he/she returns a higher score for any hole than the score actually taken, the score as returned stands. The competitor should make sure the marker has signed the scorecard, sign the scorecard themselves and hand in the scorecard. No alteration may be made on a scorecard after the competitor has handed it in and left the scoring area. The scorecard is considered to have been handed in when the competitor leaves the scoring area.
18. **ELECTRONIC DEVICES / CELL PHONES:** While electronic device/cell phone use has become a part of everyday life, the OSAA believes that appropriate and considerate use of these devices is necessary at our golf state championships.
  - a. **Players:** Players shall not take any electronic device on to the golf course, including cell phones. If a player uses such a device at any point during his/her round, he/she may be subject to disqualification.

- b. **Coaches and Spectators**: Cell phones must be set to vibrate or silent mode and shall not ring at any time while on the golf course. Cell phone conversations are prohibited at all times while on the golf course. If you need to take/make a call, please proceed to the clubhouse or parking lot. Thank you for being considerate of all participants and spectators.
17. **PACE OF PLAY**: The OSAA and the host courses are again emphasizing pace of play during this year's state championships. Groups are expected to adhere to the pace of play guidelines printed on their scorecard. A group's position should be immediately behind the group in front, not immediately in front of the group behind. Groups may be affected if they are behind the scheduled pace and out of position. Out of position is defined as:
- On par 3 – Having a clear hole ahead.
  - On par 4 – The group ahead replaces the flagstick before your group leaves the tee area.
  - On par 5 – The group ahead arrives on the green before your group leaves the tee area.
18. **PLAYING COURSE ON DAYS OF CHAMPIONSHIP**: No player participating, or who may participate, in the championship shall practice or play on the golf course the days of the championship, other than during their assigned round. Violators of this policy will be disqualified from the championship.
19. **PRACTICE DURING A ROUND**: Players are not permitted to practice once their round has begun. Practice putting / chipping on or near the putting green of the hole last played is prohibited during a round. Players are not allowed to practice putting / chipping at the turn in between nines.
20. **CADDIES**: Competitors are not allowed to use caddies in the State Championship.
21. **CARTS**:
- Motorized Carts – Participants** - Except as required by applicable law, participants may not use motorized golf carts in OSAA State Championships. The OSAA will evaluate, on a case-by-case basis, any request to use a motorized golf cart in OSAA State Championships due to a claimed disability. This request must be made in writing prior to the State Championship.
  - Motorized Carts – Spectators** – Spectators, including coaches, may not use motorized golf carts at OSAA State Championships. The OSAA will evaluate, on a case-by-case basis, any request by a spectator to use a motorized golf cart at OSAA State Championships due to age or a disability. This request must be made in writing prior to the State Championship.
  - Pull Carts – Participants** – Participants are allowed to use a pull cart in OSAA State Championships. Trysting Tree rents pull carts for \$4 per round. Please note that there are a limited number of pull carts available.
22. **RULES COMMITTEE**: The OSAA will have a Rules Committee at the State Championship. Rules Committee members will be on the course in clearly marked golf carts to answer questions and make rules interpretations as necessary. Committee members will have walkie talkies in order to collaborate on rulings.
23. **PROCEDURE WHEN RULES COMMITTEE NOT PRESENT**: If a competitor is doubtful of his/her rights or the correct procedure during the play of a hole he/she may, without penalty, complete the hole with two balls (Rule 3-3). After the doubtful situation has arisen and before taking further action, the competitor must announce to his/her marker or a fellow-competitor that he/she intends to play two balls and which ball he/she wishes to count if the Rules permit. If he/she fails to do so, the provisions of Rule 3-3b (ii) apply. Player invoking Rule 3-3 must report to the Rules Committee before turning in scorecard; penalty is disqualification.
24. **UNSPORTSMANLIKE BEHAVIOR**: A Rules Committee member may disqualify a player without warning for unsportsmanlike conduct such as throwing a club, disrespectfully addressing or striking an opponent or official, using profanity or obscene gestures, intentionally obstructing an opponent's line of play, etc.
- Any disqualification for unsportsmanlike conduct disqualifies the player for the entire championship. Substitution of a player disqualified for unsportsmanlike conduct is not permitted.
  - Disqualification for a violation of USGA rules applies to that day's competition only.
25. **SUSPENSION OF PLAY – WEATHER / LIGHTNING**: When play is suspended by the committee, if the players in a match or group are between the play of two holes, they must not resume play until the committee has ordered a resumption of play. If they have started play of a hole, they may discontinue play immediately or continue play of the hole, provided they do so without delay. If the players choose to continue play of the hole, they are permitted to discontinue play before completing it. Before lifting the ball, the player must mark its position. The players must resume play when the committee has ordered a resumption of play. An air horn will be used to notify players of a suspension of play.

26. **CLOSE OF COMPETITION:** The competition shall be deemed to have closed when all scores have been turned in and the awards ceremony is completed.
27. **RESTROOMS / WATER ON COURSE:** Trysting Tree has on-course restrooms near holes 5, 11, 14 and 16. Restrooms are also available in the clubhouse. Water fountains are placed around the course near holes 2, 7, 10, and 12.
28. **FOOD:** Trysting Tree has a full service snack bar / restaurant in the clubhouse.
29. **AWARDS:** All awards will be presented following the conclusion of each championship on Tuesday.
  - a. **Trophies** – Champion through fourth place trophies will be awarded in each championship.
  - b. **Medals** – Medals will be presented to the champion and second place teams in each championship. Medals will also be presented to the top ten individuals at each state championship who will be recognized as members of the U.S. Bank/Les Schwab Tires All-Tournament Team.
  - c. **Moda Health Athlete of the Meet** – The medalist in each classification will be recognized as that classification’s Moda Health Athlete of the Meet. In the event of a tie for medalist, multiple winners will be recognized. The winners will receive a certificate and commemorative gift from Moda Health the week following the championships. The certificate and gift will be mailed to the student’s athletic director.
  - d. **Flags** – The Oregon Golf Course Superintendents Association (OGCSA) has generously donated logo flags for use during each of this year’s state championships. Their goal is to familiarize young golfers with the OGCSA and bring awareness to their role in the game today. The logo flags will be distributed to the top finishers at each of this year’s state championships.

## TRYSTING TREE GOLF CLUB – LOCAL RULES

The USGA Rules of Golf and OSAA rules will govern all play except as modified by the following Local Rules:

- A. Please disregard all local rules on the Trysting Tree scorecard.
- B. Play will be from the BLUE for boys and the RED tee markers for girls.
- C. The one ball rule is not in effect.
- D. **Time of Starting and Groups (Rule 6-3):** If the player arrives at his/her starting point, ready to play, within five minutes after his/her starting time, in the absence of circumstances that warrant waiving the penalty of disqualification as provided in Rule 33-7, the penalty for failure to start on time is loss of two strokes at the first hole in stroke play instead of disqualification. Penalty for lateness beyond five minutes is disqualification.
- E. **Obstructions (Rule 24):** The large drainage pipes are deemed obstructions. For protective screens, including the driving range, the nearest point of relief must be determined without crossing over, through, or under this obstruction. Relief from staked trees is from the stake and/or tie only. Immovable obstructions include the following: paths and roads, white lined areas tying into artificially surfaced roads and paths have same status as paths and roads, drinking fountains, rest rooms, course irrigation sprinklers and drainage culverts not in a water hazard (**The bare ground at their entrance are part of each obstruction.**)
- F. **Abnormal Ground Conditions (Rule 25):** Casual water is any temporary accumulation of water on the course that is visible before or after the player takes his stance, and is not in a water hazard. Relief: Refer to Rule 25-1.
- G. **Ground Under Repair (Rule 25):** Defined by white lines. Also, all French drains including open French drains.
- H. **Practice Putting Greens, Wrong Putting Green (Rule 25-3):** If a player has interference from the lie of the ball from the practice putting greens the player must take relief under Rule 25-3 – Wrong Putting Green.
- I. **Embedded Ball:** Shall be in effect “through the green”. “Through the green” is defined as the whole area of the golf course except for the teeing ground and putting green of the hole being played; and all hazards on the course. Anywhere “through the green” a ball which is embedded in its own pitch mark may be lifted without penalty, cleaned and dropped as near as possible to the spot where it lay but not nearer the hole. The ball must first strike a part of the course through the green.
  - **Exception:** A player may not take relief if the ball is embedded in sand in an area that is not closely mown or if it is clearly unreasonable for the player to make a stroke because of anything other than the condition covered by this Local Rule.
- J. **Water and Lateral Water Hazards Stakes and Lines (Rule 26):** Water Hazards are defined by yellow stakes or yellow lines. Lateral Water Hazards are defined by red stakes or red lines. When both stakes and lines are used to define water and lateral water hazards, stakes indicate hazards and lines define the margin. NOTE: The quarry to the right of #5 fairway is a lateral water hazard.
- K. **Dropping Zones:**
  - Holes #9 and #18, behind the greens. If you are entitled to relief from the cart path and/or the clubhouse as an additional option, you may use the drop area provided, without penalty, but you must use the drop area nearest to where the original ball lay.
  - Hole #10, on the forward tee, as an additional option, under penalty of one-stroke, for a ball which last crossed the margin of the right lateral water hazard.
- L. **Out of Bounds (Rule 27):** Out of bounds is defined by inside edge at ground level of the large white stakes or fence posts which may be part of wooden, barbed wire or chain-link property fences.
- M. **Provisional Ball (Rule 27):** A player should play a provisional ball for any shot that may be lost outside a water hazard or out of bounds. The player must inform his marker or a fellow competitor that he intends to play a provisional ball, and must play it before he goes forward to search for the original ball.
