SUBJECT: Summary of Executive Board Action at the February 9, 2015, Meeting

At the meeting on February 9, 2015, the OSAA Executive Board took the following actions:

- Voted to approve the minutes of the December 8, 2014, Executive Board meeting.
- Voted to approve Cooperative Sponsorship requests from Union/Cove in Football, Wrestling, Baseball and Softball for the 2015-16 school year.
- Reviewed “Best Practices” information created from the NFHS Concussion Summit held earlier this school year. The OSAA’s Sports Medicine Advisory Committee will review the document and bring any recommendations back to the Board.
- Voted to approve a Common Interest and Information Sharing Agreement in conjunction with the Illinois High School Association (IHSA) in response to a class action complaint filed in Illinois regarding concussion management protocols.
- Reviewed information on the recently enacted ImPACT Concussion Management Program undertaken by the OSAA Foundation. The program will be administered by the OSAA Foundation and help reduce the cost of pre- and post-tests for member schools.
- Reviewed information regarding USA Football’s Heads Up Certification Program for coaches. Discussion included member school concerns regarding the program (cost, indemnification, frequency of training, etc.) and potential implementation timelines.
- Voted to sponsor a revised proposal with updated language from OSAA counsel to the April 13 Delegate Assembly Meeting to Amend Article 3.1.7 “Membership and Dues, Full Membership, Financial Assistance” to require schools providing need-based tuition assistance use an agency approved by the Association.

- Voted to sponsor a proposal to the April 13 Delegate Assembly Meeting to Amend Rule 6.2 “Adding a Sport/Activity” to change the threshold from a percentage of schools to a fixed number participating before the Delegate Assembly will consider adding the sport/activity. **(Attached)**
- Voted to sponsor a proposal to the April 13 Delegate Assembly Meeting to Amend Rule 6.3 “Deleting a Sport/Activity” to change the threshold from a percentage of schools to a fixed number participating before the Delegate Assembly will consider deleting the sport/activity. **(Attached)**
- Received a first reading of proposals to Amend Rule 8.6.3.c “Foreign Student Eligibility” and Rule 8.6.3.e “Students who reside on campus at a member boarding school” tying eligibility of foreign students exclusively to CSIET-approved programs. The Board suggested Staff explore the concept of allowing participation at the sub-varsity level for foreign students and bring back for another first reading at a future Board meeting.
- Voted to adopt a proposal to amend “Participation Limitations – Softball” removing the two-inning pitching limitation on softball pitchers in softball jamborees, effective immediately.

- Voted to adopt Golf State Championships Regional Formats for each classification, effective immediately. **(Attached)**
- Voted to adopt a proposal to Amend Board Policy “State Championships – Individual Sports Substitutions” for cross country and golf, effective immediately. **(Attached)**
- Voted to adopt a proposal from the Dance Drill Coaches Association (DDCA) for future OSAA State Championships.
- Voted to appoint the 2014-15 Budget Committee. **(Attached)**
- Received a report on 2014-15 Fall State Championship revenue from Tom Welter.
- Voted to approve playoff allocations for 2015 3A and 2A/1A Baseball and Softball. **(Attached)**
- Voted to approve an Independent Status request from Jefferson (3A) for boys soccer for two years.
- Voted to approve a Cooperative Sponsorship request from Lebanon and Central Linn in Baseball for one year.
- Voted to approve a request for a change in Special District placement for Crook County Girls Golf from SD #2 to SD #1 for the 2015 season.
- Voted to approve a request for a change in Special District placement for City Christian Boys Soccer from SD #6 to SD #4 for the 2015 season.
- Received a Rankings Committee report from Peter Weber, OSAA Assistant Executive Director.
- Reviewed information regarding the COSA Interdistrict Transfer/Open Enrollment Committee’s proposal to combine the two transfer policies into one policy through legislative action.
- Received a report on Executive Board vacancies for 2015-16 from Tom Welter.
- Received an Oregon Athletic Directors Association (OADA) report from Kris Welch, OADA Executive Director.
- Received an Oregon Athletic Coaches Association (OACA) report from Rob Younger, OACA Executive Director.
- Received an Oregon Athletic Officials Association (OAOA) report from Clark Sanders, OAOA Associate Director.
- Received a Student Activity Advisory Committee (SAAC) report from Cindy Simmons, OSAA Assistant Executive Director.

Proposal to Amend Proposed Article 3.1.7 “Membership and Dues, Full Membership, Financial Assistance”

(Action Item)

QUESTION: *Should the Executive Board propose new language to the Delegate Assembly to add Article 3.1.7 “Membership and Dues, Full Membership, Financial Assistance” requiring full member schools that grant financial assistance to students use an agency approved by the Executive Director to evaluate and award that financial assistance?*

RATIONALE: Concerns have grown over the years regarding the financial assistance that full member private schools grant to students, specifically by schools that make grant determinations in-house. Many full member private schools already use an outside agency to make these determinations. Requiring full member schools to use an approved agency would bring increased consistency and transparency to a process that is perceived to currently lack both. This new language was suggested by OSAA legal counsel.

RULE CHANGE SPONSORED BY: OSAA Executive Board.

POSSIBLE RULE CHANGES:

Rule 3.1 – Membership and Dues, Full Membership

High schools within the State of Oregon, public or private, are eligible for full membership in the Association if they meet all of the following qualifications:

- 3.1.1** Subscribe to the Articles, Rules, Executive Board Policies, Executive Board Interpretations, Participation Limitations, Sports Seasons and Officials Fees (collectively, the Regulations) of the Association.
- 3.1.2** Pay general membership dues and participation fees annually as established by the Executive Board.
- 3.1.3** Offer a comprehensive curriculum, which meets Oregon graduation requirements.
- 3.1.4** Serve a minimum of 10 students in grades 9-12 or 10-12. A school with fewer than 10 students may be eligible for Associate Membership.
- 3.1.5** Participate only against schools that are members of the OSAA or schools that are members of the member associations of the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) if the activity is sponsored by the OSAA, unless an exception is granted in writing by the Executive Director.
- 3.1.6** EXCEPTION: Schools for which application of these rules is inappropriate may apply to the Executive Board for an exemption from one or more of the qualifications by providing written justification for the exemption with the “Membership Application – Full.”
- 3.1.7** *Assure that no financial assistance will be provided on the basis of a student's potential or participation in OSAA-sanctioned activities. Need-based financial assistance will be based on an evaluation of information provided from an outside agency approved by the Executive Director.*

Proposal to Amend Rule 6.2 “Adding a Sport/Activity”

(Action Item)

QUESTION: *Should the Executive Board propose to the Delegate Assembly that Rule 6.2 “Adding a Sport/Activity” be amended to move from a percentage to a fixed number of schools participating before the Delegate Assembly will consider adding the sport/activity?*

RATIONALE: Moving from four to six classifications several years back necessitated a change in the threshold levels for adding/deleting a sport/activity. The OSAA staff believes that these polices once again need to be amended to maintain the feasibility and viability of current and future sanctioned sports/activities of the Association. Changing to a static number, rather than basing the minimum on a percentage of one classification, will better stand the test of time and any future changes to classifications when deciding to add/delete an activity.

Rule 6 – Association Sports/Activities

- 6.2. Adding a Sport/Activity.** The Delegate Assembly may consider adding a championship in a sport/activity where no championship is currently provided by the Association if the quantity of member schools ~~sponsoring~~ **participating in** the sport/**activity** is equal to at least ~~75% of the quantity of 6A classification~~ **50** schools.

Proposal to Amend Rule 6.3 “Deleting a Sport/Activity”

(Action Item)

QUESTION: *Should the Executive Board propose to the Delegate Assembly that Rule 6.3 “Deleting a Sport/Activity” be amended to move from a percentage to a fixed number of schools participating before the Delegate Assembly will consider deleting the sport/activity?*

RATIONALE: Moving from four to six classifications several years back necessitated a change in the threshold levels for adding/deleting a sport/activity. The OSAA staff believes that these polices once again need to be amended to maintain the feasibility and viability of current and future sanctioned sports/activities of the Association. Rule 6 – Association Sports/Activities

- 6.3. Deleting a Sport/Activity.** The Delegate Assembly may consider deleting a sport/activity if the quantity of member schools participating in the sport/activity falls lower than ~~75% of the quantity of schools in the 6A classification~~ **50 schools**.

2015 OSAA Golf State Championship – Regional Formats

6A Boys and Girls – League and Regional qualification (6 Leagues, 3 Regions)

- Teams: League champion will be automatically inserted into the state championship field (6). Teams that finished 2, 3, and 4 from league go to the regional tourney where they are paired with another league's 2, 3, and 4 teams. (PIL & Metro, Mt. Hood & Three Rivers, Greater Valley & Southwest). Each region will send two teams to state (6).
- Individuals: Two players not on the league champion team will be automatically inserted into the state championship field. If the individual's team qualifies for the regional, they may participate with their team. If their team qualifies through the regional, the next highest league placing individual will be inserted into their place as long as they are within the top 20 of the league (12). Individuals that finished in places 3-7 from the league go to the regional tourney where they will be included with another leagues same placing individuals (see allocations above). Top 5 individuals from the regional not on qualifying teams will move on to state (maximum of 15).

5A Boys and Girls – Regional qualification (2 Regions)

- Boys – Top 5 teams. Top 10 individuals not on qualifying teams. If any of the top 10 individual qualifiers are members of qualifying teams, no additional individuals will qualify.
- Girls – Top 4 teams. Top 10 individuals not on qualifying teams. If any of the top 10 individual qualifiers are members of qualifying teams, no additional individuals will qualify.

4A Boys – Regional qualification (4 Regions)

- Teams: Special District 1 - 3; Special District 2 - 3; Special District 3 - 2; Special District 4 – 2
- Individuals: Top 5 individuals not on qualifying teams. If any of the top 10 individual qualifiers are members of qualifying teams, no additional individuals will qualify.

3A/2A/1A Boys - Regional qualification (4 Regions)

- Teams: Special District 1 - 2; Special District 2 - 3; Special District 3 - 4; Special District 4 – 3
- Individuals: Top 5 individuals not on qualifying teams. If any of the top 10 individual qualifiers are members of qualifying teams, no additional individuals will qualify.

4A/3A/2A/1A Girls –

- Teams: Special District 1 - 2; Special District 2 - 3; Special District 3 - 2; Special District 4 – 2
- Individuals: Top 5 individuals not on qualifying teams. If any of the top 10 individual qualifiers are members of qualifying teams, no additional individuals will qualify.

Proposal to amend “State Championships – Individual Sport Substitutions”

(Action Item)

QUESTION: Should the Executive Board amend “State Championships – Individual Sports Substitutions” to clarify current practice in light of recent changes to qualifying procedures in cross country and golf?

RATIONALE: Changes in qualifying procedures approved by the Executive Board last Spring have identified a need to clarify individual sport substitution procedures in cross country and golf.

State Championships – Individual Sport Substitutions

70. State Championships – Individual Sport Substitutions

(Revised Fall 2013)

- A. The following shall be the policy for substitutions in individual sport State Championship events. All individuals who are substitutes for individual qualifiers must have participated in a District or Special District Meet.
- B. Cross Country
- 1) Individuals: ~~Substitutions for individual qualifiers not members of qualifying teams are not permitted. If any individual qualifier drops out of the state championship by 4pm two business days prior to the state championships, the district may substitute the next eligible individual qualifier not a member of a qualifying team.~~
The district must notify the OSAA office of any such substitution by 4pm at least two business days prior to the state championship.
 - 2) Team: Substitutions on qualified teams may be made up to 30 minutes prior to the start of the state championship race at that classification. A team may enter a maximum of seven participants with its top five finishers counting toward team standings.
- C. Golf
- 1) Individuals:
 - a) **6A:** If any individual qualifier drops out of the state championship by 4pm two business days prior to the state championship, the district **or regional (depending on how the individual originally qualified)** may substitute the next eligible individual qualifier not a member of a qualifying team. The district must notify the OSAA office of any such substitution by 4pm two business days prior to the state championship.
 - b) **5A, 4A, 4A/3A/2A/1A, 3A/2A/1A:** **Substitutions for individual qualifiers not members of qualifying teams are not permitted.**
 - 2) Team: Substitutions on qualified teams may be made up to one hour prior to the start of each round of the state championship. A team may enter a maximum of five participants with its top four finishers counting toward team standings.
