SUBJECT: Summary of Executive Board Action at the December 5, 2016, Meeting

At the meeting on December 5, 2016, the OSAA Executive Board took the following actions:

- Approved the minutes of the September 12, 2016, Board Meeting, and October 27, 2016, Board Meeting.
- Accepted the Audit for 2015-16.
- Voted to Amend Article 3.3.1.a – Membership and Dues, Dues which increases the per activity fee from \$75 to \$85, effective August 1, 2017. **(Attached)**
- Voted to Amend Board Policy – Adding a New Sport/Activity which adjusts timelines for adoption, effective immediately. **(Attached)**
- Voted to Add Board Policy – Independent Status in a Sport which adjusts timelines for adoption, effective immediately. **(Attached)**
- Voted to Amend Participation Limitations – Wrestling which sets timelines on when wrestle-backs can be conducted, effective immediately. **(Attached)**
- Voted to Amend Participation Limitations – Volleyball which removes the option for an extra set at the school's lowest level, effective immediately. **(Attached)**
- Received a first reading to Amend Board Policy – Administrator Workshop Attendance Requirement. **(Attached)**

- Voted to approve 2017 Fall Special Districts. **(Attached)**
- Received an update on the Classification and Districting Committee from Kyle Stanfield.
- Received an Oregon Athletic Coaches Association (OACA) report from Rob Younger, OACA Executive Director, including a check for \$43,050 from the OACA for its portion of Gold Card sales.

Proposal to Amend Article 3.3.1.a. – Membership and Dues, Dues

(Action Item)

QUESTION: *Should the Executive Board amend Article 3.3.1.a. – Membership and Dues, Dues to increase the per activity fee charged to member schools from \$75 to \$85 effective in the 2017-18 school year?*

RATIONALE: Costs to administer state championship events have continued to rise over the years and the Executive Board has been hesitant to raise ticket prices significantly. Activity fees were last increased between the 2007-08 and 2008-09 school years (from \$50 to the current \$75 per activity offered). An incremental increase on a more regular timeline is preferable as compared to a substantial increase all at once.

RULE CHANGE SPONSORED BY: OSAA Executive Board

Article 3.3.1.a. – Membership and Dues, Dues

The Executive Board shall establish procedures relative to payment of membership dues and special fees for championships.

- (a) **Full Membership Dues.** Full Member school dues are \$750, plus ~~\$75~~ **\$85** for each OSAA sponsored activity in which the school participates, payable on or before October 15 of each school year.

Proposal to Amend Board Policy – Adding A New Sport/Activity

(Action Item)

QUESTION: Should the Executive Board amend Board Policy – Adding a New Sport/Activity to change the meetings at which the regular and special districts are adopted?

RATIONALE: Over the past several years the Executive Board has adopted special districts one meeting later than has been done in the past. OSAA Staff heard from member schools that the current timeline can create issues for schools when attempting to schedule for the following year. Moving the adoptions up by one Executive Board meeting will more closely align the process with when schools actually schedule contests.

ADDING A NEW SPORT/ACTIVITY ([Adding a New Sport/Activity after the Deadline](#)) (Revised Summer 2016)

A. **Adding a New Sport/Activity prior To Executive Board Adoption of Sport/Activity Specific Regular and Special Athletic Districts.**

- 1) Any full member school may add a sport/activity by indicating sponsorship of the sport/activity on the Pre-Selection Survey submitted to the OSAA prior to Executive Board adoption of sport/activity specific regular and special athletic districts.
- 2) The Executive Board Meetings at which the sport/activity specific regular and special athletic districts are adopted are:
 - a) Fall Sports/Activities. ~~February~~ **December** Executive Board Meeting.
 - b) Winter Sports/Activities. ~~May~~ **February** Executive Board Meeting.
 - c) Spring Sports/Activities. ~~September~~ **May** Executive Board Meeting.
- 3) If the OSAA is notified of the addition of the sport/activity prior to the above listed Executive Board meeting for the season of that sport/activity, the school's team in that sport/activity shall be eligible for district or state honors, and league approval is not required for the addition of the sport/activity.

B. **Adding a New Sport/Activity after Executive Board Adoption of Sport/Activity Specific Regular and Special Athletic Districts.**

- 1) Should a full member school wish to add a new sport/activity after Executive Board adoption of sport/activity specific regular and special districts, and the school wishes the team to be eligible for district and state honors, the following procedure shall be followed:
 - a) The school shall complete and submit to the OSAA an "Adding a New Sport/Activity after the Deadline" form.

- b) The form must include the signature of a representative of the regular or special district in which the team will be added indicating league support for the addition.
 - c) The form must be received by the OSAA by the first contest date for that sport/activity.
- 2) Should a full member school wish to add a new sport/activity after Executive Board adoption of sport/activity specific regular and special districts, and the school does NOT wish the team to be eligible for district and state honors, the following procedure shall be followed:
- a) The school shall complete and submit to the OSAA an “Adding a New Sport/Activity after the Deadline” form.
 - b) The signature of a representative of the regular or special district in which the team will be added indicating league support for the addition is NOT required.

Proposal to Amend Board Policy – Independent Status in a Sport

(Action Item)

QUESTION: Should the Executive Board amend Board Policy – Independent Status in a Sport to change the deadlines for when Independent Status Petitions are due?

RATIONALE: Over the past several years the Executive Board has reviewed Independent Status Petitions one meeting later than has been done in the past. OSAA Staff heard from member schools that the current timeline can create issues for schools when attempting to schedule for the following year. Moving the deadlines up by one Executive Board meeting will more closely align the process with when schools actually schedule contests.

INDEPENDENT STATUS IN A SPORT

[\(Independent Status Petition\)](#)

(Fall 2015)

- A. OSAA member schools shall participate in the league adopted schedule for each sport they sponsor unless an “Independent Status Petition” has been granted by the OSAA Executive Board. A school granted independent status in a sport by the Executive Board is not eligible to participate for District or State honors in that sport, regardless of win/loss record.
- B. A member school submitting an “Independent Status Petition” shall provide the following information for consideration by the Executive Board:
 - 1) League record in the sport for the previous three years.
 - 2) Overall record in the sport for the previous three years.
 - 3) Yearly participation numbers in the sport for the previous three years.
 - 4) Coaching history for the previous three years.
 - 5) A letter of league support or non-support for the proposed independent status.
- C. A member school seeking independent status in a sport shall be required to complete and submit an “Independent Status Petition” to the OSAA according to the timelines listed below. A member school seeking independent status is also responsible for notifying all league members in writing of the “Independent Status Petition” according to these same timelines:
 - 1) **Fall Sports.** Prior to the ~~February~~ **December** Executive Board Meeting.
 - 2) **Winter Sports.** Prior to the ~~May~~ **February** Executive Board Meeting.
 - 3) **Spring Sports.** Prior to the ~~September~~ **May** Executive Board Meeting.
- D. An “Independent Status Petition” in a sport shall be granted by the Executive Board for a minimum of two years.
- E. League playoff allocations to OSAA State Championships in a sport may be impacted if a school in a league is granted independent status by the Executive Board.

Proposal to Amend Participation Limitations – Wrestling

(Action Item)

QUESTION: *Should the Executive Board amend Participation Limitations – Wrestling to place time restrictions on when a match can begin?*

RATIONALE: The NFHS rule that allows five matches in one day is being manipulated by some events in order to accommodate tournament formats that require a “wrestle-back” to take place. These events conduct the wrestle-back, which in most cases would be the sixth match for a wrestler, after midnight in order to avoid the five match per day conflict. They use this manipulation to avoid having to conduct a multiple day event.

RULE CHANGE SPONSORED BY: OSAA Executive Board

1. WRESTLING

(Revised Fall 2016)

A. **Team.** A school team shall not compete on more than 14 events at each level of competition, exclusive of the varsity special district tournament and state championships. Each dual match or tournament shall count as one event. Any time a student participates representing his/her school, it shall count toward the school’s team limitation.

B. **Individual.**

- 1) A student shall not participate in more than 14 events, 18 weigh-ins nor shall a student appear in more than 50 mat appearances, exclusive of the varsity special district tournament and state championships. Each victory (including forfeits accepted) or defeat is counted as a mat appearance.
- 2) ***A student shall not participate in more than five (5) matches per day, excluding forfeits. No match (dual, consolation or championship) shall begin prior to 8am or after 11pm.***

Note: If a wrestler does not wrestle during a dual match because no opponent is available at that weight class, either a forfeit can be accepted, counting the match as one of the wrestler's 50 allowable mat appearances, or else a forfeit is not accepted by not appearing on the mat, thus not counting the match as one of the 50 allowable mat appearances.

Proposal to Amend Participation Limitations – Volleyball

(Action Item)

QUESTION: *Should the Executive Board amend Participation Limitations – Volleyball to delete the extra set at the freshman level (or at the junior varsity level if there is no freshman team)?*

RATIONALE: A change by the Executive Board last year allows schools to play a best of 3 out of 5 match at the sub-varsity level. Per NFHS Volleyball rules, teams may mutually agree to shorten a match at any point during the match. The language allowing for an extra set has caused confusion for some schools and is no longer needed.

RULE CHANGE SPONSORED BY: OSAA Executive Board

NEXT STEP IF PASSED: Effective immediately unless otherwise stated in the motion.

VOLLEYBALL

(Revised May 2013)

- A. **Team.** A school team shall not compete on more than 18 playing dates at each level of competition, exclusive of the varsity district playoffs and state championships.
- B. **Individual.** A student shall not compete on more than 18 playing dates, exclusive of varsity district playoffs and state championships. Additionally, a student shall not compete in more than one set in addition to one match per day. Once a player participates in the second set of a match that constitutes their match for that day. If a student exceeds the limit, the match in which the limit is exceeded shall be forfeited. A student may participate in only one jamboree.

~~An extra set may be played at the freshman level (or at the junior varsity level if there is no freshman team), providing both schools agree and the officials agree. The extra set is intended to provide an opportunity for those students whose play was limited in the regular contest. In no case shall a student exceed the one match plus one set limit. **An extra set will only be allowed when best 2/3 sets format is used. It is not allowed with best 3/5 format.**~~

EXCEPTION: The individual limit of one set in addition to one match per day does not apply to double duals or tournament play. In tournament play, a student may participate in only one level of competition during that day. Double duals involve two or three teams competing on one day. In double dual play, a student may participate in multiple levels of play and may play in a maximum of 10 sets during that day.

Proposal to Amend Board Policy – Administrator Workshop Attendance Requirement

(First Reading)

QUESTION: *Should the Executive Board amend Board Policy – Administrator Workshop Attendance Requirement to increase the penalty for non-compliance?*

RATIONALE: The OSAA Staff puts on seven Administrator Workshops each August, including several via webcast, in order to update schools on rule changes and upcoming initiatives, along with a review of eligibility rules and the OSAA website. It's vital that schools have an administrator in attendance at one of these workshops. The current penalty for non-compliance doesn't accurately reflect the expectation the Board places on this requirement.

RULE CHANGE SPONSORED BY: OSAA Executive Board

ADMINISTRATOR WORKSHOP ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT ([2016 Workshop Schedule](#)) (Revised Fall 2006)

- A. Each member school shall ensure that at least one representative participates in one of the annual Administrator Workshops presented by OSAA staff. Roll shall be taken at the Workshops to confirm compliance with this policy.

- B. Should it be determined that a member school failed to have a representative at any of the Administrator Workshops, that school shall ***have an administrator view a recorded version of the workshop within five (5) days, receive a \$1,000 fine, appear before the Executive Board at their next meeting and*** be placed on probation during the Association Year of non-attendance. The Executive Board shall consider the probationary status of the school when assigning penalties for any violations of OSAA Regulations by the school that might occur during the period of probation.

Proposal to Amend Board Policy – Football – 45-Point Rule/Alternative Plan/Running Clock

(First Reading)

QUESTION: *Should the Executive Board amend Board Policy – Football – 45-Point Rule/Alternative Plan/Running Clock to eliminate the options for terminating the game and the Alternative Plan?*

RATIONALE: Since 2008 member schools have determined which of the three options for the 45-point rule will be used throughout all football games in their respective classifications. For several years the only option that has been selected across all six classifications has been the running clock. Amending this policy would clean up the unnecessary language contained therein.

RULE CHANGE SPONSORED BY: OSAA Executive Board

FOOTBALL – 45-POINT RULE/ALTERNATIVE PLAN/RUNNING CLOCK

(Revised Fall 2008)

- A. ***Running Clock. If a 45-point point differential occurs at halftime or any time thereafter, a running clock shall be used. The running clock shall be started with the ready-for-play signal from the official. Once the running clock is started, it shall be stopped only for the following reasons:***
- a) ***For measurement of a possible first down.***
 - b) ***For a player who appears to be injured.***
 - c) ***For unusual heat or humidity which may create a health risk to players.***
 - d) ***For a coach/referee conference concerning the misapplication of a rule.***
 - e) ***When a TV/radio time out is granted.***
 - f) ***For a one-minute intermission between the third and fourth periods and following a try, successful field goal, or a safety.***
 - g) ***A team time out is granted.***
 - h) ***When a team attempts to conserve or consume time.***
 - i) ***Any unusual circumstances (dog on field, etc.).***
- B. Each 6A, 5A, 4A, 3A, 2A, 1A classification shall report to the OSAA which of the following three options listed in B has been adopted by the classification to address football games in which one team leads by 45 or more points at halftime. 1A classification is limited to options one and three. The selected option ***running clock*** shall apply to all levels (varsity, JV, sophomore and frosh). The selected option ***and*** shall remain from year to year until the classification notifies the OSAA of a change. ***The running clock shall be in effect for Football State Championship games, first round through final site.***
- ~~C. For non-league contests, the option adopted by the athletic district of the host school shall be followed. For Football State Championship games, the option adopted by that classification shall be in effect.~~

- 1) ~~**Option 1 – 45-Point Rule.**~~ A football game is terminated if either team leads by 45 points or more at halftime or at any time thereafter.
- 2) ~~**Option 2 – Alternative Plan.**~~ A completed “Football 45-Point Alternative Plan Report” shall be submitted to the District Committee of the winning school by each school involved in any game with a final point differential of 45 points or more.
 - a) ~~The Reports must be received by the District Committee prior to the winning school’s next contest or within seven days of the contest in question. If the losing school agrees there was no effort to run up the score, there shall be no action by the Committee, except to forward a copy of the forms to the OSAA office. If the losing school reports that the winning school did run up the score, the Committee shall consider the matter within 10 days and send a complete report to the OSAA office.~~
 - b) ~~If a majority of the members of the District Committee agree that the winning school did run up the score, the Committee shall meet with the winning school’s administration and coach to seek solutions that will prevent the same from happening in the future.~~
 - c) ~~A second offense of running up the score by a school during the same season shall be reported to the OSAA Executive Board. In the event that a school is found by the Executive Board to have run up the score a second time during the same season, the school shall subject to any of the penalties set forth in Rule 5 as determined by the Executive Board.~~
- 3) ~~**Option 3 – Running Clock.**~~ If the point differential occurs at halftime or any time thereafter, a running clock shall be used. The running clock shall be started with the ready for play signal from the official. Once the running clock is started, it shall be stopped only for the following reasons:
 - j) ~~For measurement of a possible first down.~~
 - k) ~~For a player who appears to be injured.~~
