- 1. Whereas, Psilocybin has also been shown to be 95% effective at extending
- 2. periods of remission between cluster headache attacks; and

- 4. Whereas, Psilocybin has been shown to be 52% effective at ending cluster
- 5. headache periods; and

6.

- 7. Whereas, Psilocybin is currently a Schedule I Narcotic according to the
- 8. Drug Enforcement Agency; and

9.

- 10. Whereas, To be a Schedule I Narcotic, a substance must have "no accepted
- 11. medical use"; now,

12.

- 13. Therefore be it resolved, That the congress here assembled would make the
- 14. recommendation to reschedule Psilocybin into a drug class better tailored to
- 15. grant access to this treatment for sufferers of cluster headaches and allow for
- 16. testing of other possible benefits.

- 15. LGBTQ+ community; now, therefore, be it

- 17. Resolved by the Congress here assembled that the FDA should lift its ban
- 18. on blood donations by gay men.

A Resolution to Maintain Current Levels of Support For NATO

- 1. Whereas, President Trump has been ambiguous as to his position on
- 2. continued US support for the North Atlantic Treaty Organization
- 3. (henceforth referred to as "NATO"); and

- 5. Whereas, NATO remains a necessary institution to maintain European
- 6. peace and security, check Russian aggression, and resolve international
- 7. crises; and

- 9. Whereas, Millions of people in Afghanistan, the Balkans, and elsewhere
- 10. depend on NATO to build lasting security and stability; and

11.

- 12. Whereas, Nationalist, isolationist trends in Western Europe suggest that, if
- 13. the US withdraws support from NATO, no other member could fully fill the
- 14. gap; and

15.

- 16. Whereas, Without US engagement and political support, the organization
- 17. would collapse entirely, with no viable replacement; now,

18.

- 19. Therefore be it resolved that the Congress here assembled recommends that
- 20. the President, State Department, and Defense Department of the United
- 21. States maintain their firm commitment to and financial and political
- 22. support for NATO.

1. Whereas, Many states retain inefficient systems for conducting elections;

- 9. Whereas, The state of Oregon utilizes two highly efficient and simple
- 10. systems for voter registration and conducting elections.

- 12. Whereas, All state elective processes should be conducted using the Oregon
- 13. Vote by Mail system.

14.

- 15. Whereas, States will use the Oregon Motor Voter system as a model for
- 16. registration.

- 18. Therefore be it resolved by the Congress here assembled that all state
- 19. elective processes should be conducted using the Oregon Vote by Mail
- 20. system.

A Bill to Aid Low Income Families With College Costs

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. SECTION 1. This bill would provide assistance to families who do not
- 2. have enough income to fully pay for college. The following requirements would
- 3. determine eligibility.
- 4. A. The capability to successfully demonstrate the completion of A minimum of
- 5. 90 college credit hours.
- 6. B. Maintain a minimum grade point average of 2.00.
- 7. C. Are currently enrolled in an Oregon 4-year public college, and in their first 2
- 8. years of being enrolled have completed requirements Section 1, sub point a and b.
- 9. D. Been a permanent resident of Oregon for a minimum of 5 years.
- 10. E. Your household income does not exceed the median household income for
- 11. the State of Oregon (currently \$50,000).

12.

- 13. SECTION 2. The State shall provide funding for 90 additional credit hours, only if the
- 14. above criteria are met.

15.

16. SECTION 3. Funding for this program shall be through the Oregon Lottery.

17.

- 18. SECTION 4. The starting of this program shall commence at the start of the 2019-2020
- 19. academic school year.
- 20. A. The program will qualify to anyone who has not only met the requirements
- 21. listed in section 1.
- 22. B. Also be the first year they have been enrolled in any Oregon Public 4-year
- 23. institution.

24.

- 25. SECTION 5. All programs funded through the Oregon Lottery are now funded by The
- 26. State Marijuana Tax, and all expenses from this bill would be used from 75% of the
- 27. Oregon Lottery funding.
- 28. A. Additionally, all programs funded by the state Marijuana Tax are now funded
- 29. through the Lottery Fund.
- 30. B. All excess money will be added into the State General Fund.

A Bill to Shut Down Nationalized Lotteries

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. SECTION 1. Federal, State, County, and City run gambling and
- 2. lottery systems will be made federally illegal.

3.

- 4. SECTION 2. Gambling and lottery systems are defined as chance
- 5. based activities in which money is exchange in return for the
- 6. improbable or probable ability to create a profit.
- 7. A. This includes, Powerball, Scratch tickets, online poker, and all
- 8. other government managed gambling systems
- 9. B. This does not include the national or international stock
- 10. exchange.
- 11. C. This does not include casino style gambling on Native American
- 12. Reservations.
- 13. D. However, this does include casinos on non-Native owned land.

14.

- 15. SECTION 3. Discretion regulation will be managed by a new Federal
- 16. Lottery Enforcement Commission which will be formulated out of the
- 17. past Federal Lottery Commission, which shall be funded by the
- 18. taxes currently in place on the remaining, legal gambling
- 19. systems.
- 20. A. Any possible corruption will be investigated by The Federal
- 21. Bureau of Investigation (FBI).

22.

- 23. SECTION 4. The provisions of this bill shall take effect on the first day
- 24. of the year following the passage of this bill.

25.

- 26. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
- 27. declared null and void.

A Bill to Delay Construction of Gerald R. Ford Class Carriers to Reassess Navel Strategy and Reduce Federal Expenditures

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. SECTION 1. All further construction of Gerald R. Ford class aircraft
- 2. carriers will be talked until FY 2027.

3.

- 4. SECTION 2. Huntington Ingalls Industries ins instructed to delay
- 5. construction on the ships until the specified date. Until the specified date, no
- 6. further funds for construction will be provided by the government of the
- 7. United States.

8.

- 9. SECTION 3. The United States Department of the Treasury and the
- 10. United States Department of Defense will have joint authority in enforcing
- 11. this legislation.
- 12. A. Payment for ships already completed will continue; payment for
- 13. ships yet to be completed will be resumed on the specified date.
- 14. B. The saved funding will be added to the federal budget to be
- 15. apportioned in further spending resolutions.
- 16. C. The saved funding may not be apportioned towards the
- 17. construction of additional aircraft carriers before the specified date.

18.

- 19. SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect beginning FY 2018 and
- 20. end FY 2027.

21.

- 22. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
- 23. declared null and void.

A Bill to Advance the U.S. – India Partnership

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. SECTION 1. Under the joint jurisdiction of the Department of State and
- 2. Department of Defense, the Arms Export Control Act will be amended to extend
- 3. pecial foreign military sales status to India and institutionalize an annual defense
- 4. policy dialogue to coordinate with the Ministry of Defense for the Government of
- 5. India on
- 6. A. Combined military planning for missions such as disaster relief, maritime
- 7. domain awareness, and other missions deemed to be in the national security
- 8. interests of both countries
- 9. B. Defense procurement planning to include humanitarian assistance and
- 10. border maintenance and control

11.

- 12. SECTION 2. "Special foreign military sales" status is a state classification of security
- 13. assistance authorized by Arms Export Control Act (AECA).
- 14. A. The funding for provided weapons shall come from the India's national
- 15. funds and shall be subsidized on a per purchase basis
- 16. B. India has become an instrumental partner in delivering humanitarian
- 17. and disaster relief in the Asia-Pacific region as the India Air Force has sued
- 18. United States-origin C-130 and C-17 aircraft to evacuate Indian, American,
- 19. and third-country nationals and send relief supplies.

20.

- 21. SECTION 3. The President shall include India on the list of countries eligible
- 22. for the strategic trade authorization exception under section 740.20(c) (1) of title 15,
- 23. Code of Federal Regulations.
- 24. A. If India utilizes US military hardware and software in a manner that is
- 25. not conducive to US strategic interests, subsidies provided shall be voided and
- 26. India shall be responsible for the full cost of its purchases.

27.

28. SECTION 4. This legislation will go into effect January 2018

29.

- 30. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
- 31. and void.

A Bill to Depoliticize Intelligence

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. SECTION 1. The Director of the Central Intelligence Association
- 2. (CIA) shall have a ten-year term limit.

3.

- 4. SECTION 2. A term limit expiring after 10 years shall be installed to
- 5. the position of CIA director in order to depoliticize the position and promote
- 6. greater honesty and communications between the offices of US government.

7.

- 8. SECTION 3. The office of the President of the United States (POTUS)
- 9. shall remain responsible for appointing new CIA directors when the need
- 10. arises either due to term expiration or a vote of no confidence.
- 11. A. Replacements shall be conducted on the first Tuesday of
- 12. February in years ending in -9 (e.g. 2019, 2029, 2039, etc.).
- 13. B. In the case of perceived danger, the legislative branch may
- 14. conduct a 'Vote of No Confidence' requiring a super-majority in each
- 15. legislature, beginning in the House of Representatives. A successful
- 16. vote will result in the removal of the CIA director.
- 17. C. In the case of director elimination POTUS shall select a
- 18. temporary director whose term will expire on the next, first Tuesday
- 19. of a year ending in -9.
- 20. D. All appointees must be confirmed by the Legislative branch by
- 21. 11majority votes in each congress.

22.

- 23.SECTION 4 The provisions of this bill shall take effect on February 5th
- 24. 1. of 2019

25.

- 26. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
- 27. declared null and void.

A Bill to Dramatically Increase Federal Funding for NASA

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. SECTION 1. The annual budget for the National Aeronautic and
- 2. Space Agency (NASA) will be increased from its current level of \$19.5
- 3. billion to \$60.0 billion, adjustable for inflation, not to be decreased until
- 4. January 1st 2028 at the earliest.
- 5. A. The funds will be allocated within NASA according to the
- 6. discretion of the NASA Administrator, in order to pursue the
- 7. objectives listed in NASA's "What's Next for NASA?" document.

8.

- 9. SECTION 2. To fund this policy, The United States federal
- 10. government will increase the corporate income tax rate by a discretionary
- 11. amount for the top 1% of American companies.
- 12. A. The "top 1%" of companies will be defined in terms of gross
- 13. income.
- 14. B. The "discretionary amount" will be computed each year to
- 15. produce \$40.5 billion in revenue, adjustable for inflation.

16.

- 17. SECTION 3. The Department of the Treasury will oversee the
- 18. enforcement of the bill along with the following specific enforcement
- 19. mechanism:
- 20. A. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) will execute the
- 21. computation and collection of the "discretionary amount."

22.

23. SECTION 4. This bill shall be implemented January 1st, 2018.

24.

- 25. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
- 26. declared null and void.

A Bill to Provide Housing for Veterans

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. SECTION 1. The U.S. Government will provide housing for veterans
- 2. who are unable to secure and sustainable living situation for themselves.

3.

- 4. SECTION 2. Housing will be defined as a building with a foundation,
- 5. roof, heating and private space, essentially warming shelters, yet the Veterans
- 6. will occupy them until they can provide a living space for themselves. Veterans
- 7. will be eligible based identification provided by the U.S. Department of
- 8. Veterans Affairs. Additional funding for the VA program will be obtained from
- 9. the U.S Department of Defense.

10.

- 11. SECTION 3. The U.S. Department of Veteran's Affairs, which is part of
- 12. the U.S. Department of defense, is best situated to provide this service with
- 13. assistance from the Department of Health and Human Services. Although there
- 14. are programs in place, they continue to fail to meet the needs of all homeless
- 15. veterans. "Of the estimated 79,500 homeless veterans who contacted the VA's
- 16. National Call Center for Homeless Veterans last year, nearly 27 percent were
- 17. unable to reach a counselor", says the Washington Times, the call center is a
- 18. faulty system and providing no help or housing for our veterans. After serving
- 19. our country, our veterans deserve to have basic shelter.

20.

- 21. SECTION 4. This shall take effect once funds are obtained for one of
- 22. these shelters in each state, one year at the most, the design of the buildings will
- 23. be decided before then as well.

24.

- 25. SECTION 5. This law supplements current laws (homeowner's/
- 26. mortgage loan viability law) with the intent of closing any discrepancies, or
- 27. faults, while providing care for our veterans.

A Bill to Help Low Income Families Pay Child Care

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. SECTION 1. The United States Federal Government shall allocate
- 2. \$100 million to a program to help fund child care for low income families.
- 3. A program will be developed to help set up a fund to pay the half
- 4. cost of families child care bills.
- 5. B. Funding will come from the overwhelming military budget.

6.

- 7. SECTION 2. "Child Care" shall be defined as the care of children by a
- 8. day care center, babysitter, or other provider while parents are working.
- 9. A. "Low Income families" shall be defined as families who have an
- 10. income of \$20,090 or less.
- 11. B. Military budget shall be defined as the budget given to the
- 12. military to help with combat.

13.

- 14. SECTION 3. The implementation of this legislation shall be overseen
- 15. by a new department called the child witness protection program.

16.

17. SECTION 4. This legislation shall be implemented on April 7, 2019.

18.

- 19. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
- 20. declared null and void.

A Bill to Denuclearize the Democratic Peoples Republic of Korea (North Korea)

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1. SECTION 1. This Bill is quid pro quo to solve the conflict in the

- 6. SECTION 2. Negotiations table is defined as the leaders of the US and
- 7. DPRK and potentially the UN and some European countries meeting
- 8. together to Negotiate the Denuclearization of the DPRK.

- 10. SECTION 3. The Department of State will oversee the arrangement of
- 11. the negotiation. If negotiations fail then the Department of State will
- 12. resume the sanction on the DPRK.

14. SECTION 4. This bill will go into effect immediately after passage

15.

- 16. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
- 17. declared null and void.
