4. **PARKING:** Eagle Crest Ridge Course allows participants and spectators to park in the main course parking lot.
5. **SPECTATOR CONDUCT AT OSAA SANCTIONED EVENTS:** (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies)
"In addition to the general expectations included in the OSAA Constitution, Rule 3, that school officials "...shall take all reasonable measures to ensure that the school's students and supporters maintain a sportsmanlike attitude toward all events..." the following specific expectations regarding spectator conduct **at all OSAA sanctioned events, including regular and post season competition**, are provided: (Revised Fall 2008)
 - A. **All cheers, comments and actions shall be in direct support of one's team. No cheers, comments or actions shall be directed at one's opponent or at contest officials. Some examples of inappropriate conduct or actions that are not permitted are: turning backs, holding up newspapers or jeering at cheerleaders during opposing team introductions; disrespecting players by name, number or position; negative cheers or chants; throwing objects on the floor. (Revised Fall 2008)**
 - B. Spectators are not permitted to have signs or banners (larger than 8 ½ by 11 inches), confetti, balloons or glass containers. Spectators are required to wear shirts.
 - C. Spectators are not permitted to have artificial noisemakers. Some examples of artificial noisemakers are Thunder Stix, cowbells, clappers and air horns.
 - D. Spectators shall not be permitted to use vulgar/offensive **or racially/culturally insensitive** language. **Spectators shall not be permitted to engage in any racially / culturally insensitive action. (Revised Fall 2008)"**

6. **CHEMICAL HEALTH POSITION** (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies): The OSAA abides by all state laws and district policies pertaining to the use of tobacco, alcohol, and illegal drugs. As a general rule, OSAA activities' sites shall be alcohol and tobacco free during OSAA events. All persons in attendance shall refrain from use of tobacco, alcohol and illegal drugs at all OSAA activities and are prohibited from being under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs at all event facilities.

PRE-STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. QUALIFICATION FOR STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS:

- a. The qualification formula from districts to the state championships is as follows for each classification:
- 1) **Teams:** Top two teams from each district.
 - 2) **Individuals:** Top three individuals from each district not members of qualifying teams.
 - 3) **Ties:** Any ties for final team or individual qualification spots shall be broken by the district prior to submitting the official state championship entry to the OSAA. No more than two teams and three individuals are allowed from each district.

2. POSTING TIMELINE:

- a. Tee times for team and individual qualifiers will be posted on the OSAA website, www.osaa.org, by 6 p.m. on Wednesday, May 13.
- b. District Meet Directors AND coaches of qualifying teams and individuals are responsible for checking the accuracy of the entry information. Please check your entries for correct spelling of participant's name, year in school, and school name, as this information *will appear the same way on the score cards, score sheets, and in the championship results unless corrected.*

4. STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – INDIVIDUAL SPORT SUBSTITUTIONS (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies):

- A. "The following shall be the policy for substitutions in individual sport State Championship events.
- C. Golf **(Revised Spring 2007)**
- 1) Individuals: If an individual qualifier drops out of the state championship by 4 p.m. two business days (Thursday, May 14) prior to the state championship, the district may substitute the next eligible individual qualifier not a member of a qualifying team.
 - (1) The district must notify the OSAA office of any such substitution by 4 p.m. two business days (Thursday, May 14) prior to the state championship.
 - 2) Team: Substitutions on qualified teams may be made up to one hour prior to the start of each round of the state championship. ***A team may enter a maximum of five participants with its top four finishers counting toward team standings.***

STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT:

- a. The State Championship will be a two-day 36-hole event. Play will commence each day at 8 a.m.
- b. **Team Competition:** A school entering a team of four or five players will be competing for the team championship. A school with less than four scores will not be considered a part of the team competition. Team scores shall be determined by adding a team's four best individual scores on the first day of play to a team's four best individual scores on the second day of play. In the event of a tie for first place at the end of the second round, the team with the lower 5th score from Tuesday's round will be declared the champion. If the teams are still tied at that point, the team with the lower 5th score from Monday's round will be declared the champion. If the teams are still tied, the teams will be declared co-champions. Ties for places other than first will not be broken.

- c. **Individual Competition:** All players in the State Championship may compete for individual honors. Ties for individual honors will not be broken.
2. **PAIRINGS / TEE TIMES:** Pairings / tee times for the first round of the State Championships will be posted to the OSAA website by 6 p.m. on Wednesday, May 13. First round pairings / tee times are rotated annually by the OSAA. Second round pairings / tee times will be posted to the OSAA website following play on Monday, May 18. Pairings for the second round will be based on first round scores with Monday's team leaders going off the #1 tee last. (see attached pairings guide for more information)
 3. **COACHES' MEETING:** There will be a coaches' meeting at 7:30 p.m. on Sunday, May 17, in the Ridge Course Deli and all coaches are encouraged to attend.
 4. **SCHOOL ASSIGNMENTS:** Schools are no longer being assigned to spots on the course during the State Championships. However, the OSAA is encouraging coaches to help in spotting balls and assist in maintaining pace of play while they are out on the course following their team members. Coaches should not make any rulings but can help to track down a member of the Rules Committee if needed.
 5. **PRACTICE ROUNDS:** Practice times will begin at 1:09 p.m. on Sunday, May 17 due to a previously scheduled event at Eagle Crest. **Coaches will not be allowed to play during the assigned practice rounds as there are only enough times to accommodate participating players. Teams will play in fivesomes and coaches are encouraged to walk the course with their players.** Participants will not be charged for this practice round. Tee times have been set aside between 2-3 p.m. on Saturday, May 16 for schools interested in playing their practice round on Saturday instead of Sunday. At the request of Eagle Crest Ridge Course, qualifying teams and individuals will be assigned practice round times by the OSAA. (Please see the attached Practice Round Tee Time Guide for general times.) Once qualifying teams and individuals are known, the OSAA will post a final list to the OSAA website. Alterations will not be made to the final list. Range balls will be available for purchase on Sunday, May 17 during practice rounds. Cost is \$4 for a small bucket and \$8 for a large bucket. Qualifying teams and individuals are allowed to play additional practice rounds at Eagle Crest Ridge Course prior to the State Championship. Contact Eagle Crest Ridge Course for rates and availability.
 6. **ATTIRE:** All participants must be properly dressed for practice rounds and the State Championship.
Girls: No jeans, denim slacks, gym sweats, or T-shirts. Walking shorts must be mid-thigh length. Sport caps must be worn bill forward. Halter tops, tanks tops, bare midriff, tube tops, or shirts with spaghetti straps are prohibited. Soft spikes may be required on some courses. **Soft spikes are required at Eagle Crest Ridge Course.**
 7. **FROST DELAY PROCEDURE:** Please contact Eagle Crest Ridge Course (541.923.5002) beginning at 6:15 a.m. on Monday or Tuesday if due to weather conditions a frost delay is possible.
 8. **RANGE BALLS:** Range balls will be provided free of charge on Monday and Tuesday prior to the start of a player's round. Large buckets of range balls will be put out on the practice range at 7 a.m. each day. Only players participating in the State Championship should be using the range during this time.
 9. **HOLE LOCATION / LOCAL RULES SHEETS:** Each player will receive a copy of that day's hole locations along with the Local Rules sheet for the State Championship on her first tee on both Monday and Tuesday. (see attached local rules sheet for more information)
 10. **SUMMER RULES:** Summer rules will be used at the State Championships. In the event of inclement weather, the OSAA Director, in conjunction with the Rules Committee and the course professional, may authorize winter rules.
 11. **YARDAGE / TEE MARKERS:** Eagle Crest Ridge Course has 150-yard markers on each hole. Yardage is also marked on sprinkler heads. All yardage is to the center of the green. Players will use the RED tee markers during both rounds of the championship. (See attached sample scorecard for this year's course yardage.) All other tee markers will be removed to avoid confusion.
 12. **RANGEFINDERS and other ELECTRONIC DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES:** Per Rule 14-3, the OSAA prohibits the use of any artificial device or unusual equipment during a competitive round for the purpose of gauging or measuring distance or conditions. These devices are allowed during practice rounds.
 13. **COACHING:** In addition to the provisions of Rule 8-1, the Note under Rule 8 of the USGA Rules of Golf will be in effect. Thus, each school may appoint one person (head coach, assistant coach, etc.) to give advice to, or ask for advice from, participants representing that school each day of the competition provided that:
 - 1) Only one person is appointed to give advice to, or ask for advice from, participants representing that school each day of the competition;
 - 2) The person is identified to the games committee before the start of the competition each day;
 - 3) The person does not give advice to, or ask for advice from, another school's participants or coaches;

- 4) The advice not be given during the playing of a hole but rather from the time a participant holes out on a hole until they tee off on the next hole (or during a suspension of play); and
- 5) The advice is given in a private manner and does not unduly delay play.

Penalty for breach of condition: By a participant – two strokes; By a coach – two strokes will be added to the coach's school's score

The OSAA will have a sign-up sheet near the scoring area for each school to identify their designated coach each day. Designated coaches will be given a lanyard to wear for identification purposes.

14. **SPECTATORS:** Spectators must stay on cart paths or in the rough and at least 30 yards from any competitor during play. At no time should a spectator be on the green, on the tee, in a fairway, in a bunker, in a hazard, nor should they stand behind a player during her swing. Spectators may not communicate with participants from the time a player begins his/her round until her scorecard is handed in. Competitors may be penalized and / or disqualified if any person, other than the designated coach, assists the competitor by coaching and / or giving advice, which could influence a player in determining play, the choice of a club or method of making a stroke. Spectators may provide a participant with food, towels, umbrellas, rain suits, etc., during a round.
15. **GOLF BALLS / GOLF CLUBS:** The ball each competitor uses must be named on the current List of Conforming Golf Balls issued by the USGA. Each competitor is strongly encouraged to put an identifying mark on his / her ball. The one ball rule is not in effect at the State Championships. Golf clubs listed on the current USGA List of Non-Conforming Driving Clubs may not be used or carried; penalty is disqualification.
16. **SCORING PROCEDURE:** Competitors will receive a scorecard on her first tee each day of the competition. Scorecards will be exchanged with another competitor from the group. Each competitor (marker) will be responsible for keeping score for another competitor in the group. After each hole, the marker should check the score with the competitor and record it. Players are asked to bring scorecards to the scoring area at the turn. Scores at the turn are unofficial.

At the conclusion of the round, the entire group should proceed immediately to the scoring area. The marker should sign the scorecard and hand it to the competitor. Competitors are to review their scorecard thoroughly for the accuracy of the hole-by-hole score and settle any doubtful points with the Rules Committee. The competitor is responsible for the correctness of the score recorded for each hole on her scorecard. If she returns a score for any hole lower than actually taken, she is disqualified. If she returns a higher score for any hole than the score actually taken, the score as returned stands. The competitor should make sure the marker has signed the scorecard, sign the scorecard themselves and hand in the scorecard. No alteration may be made on a scorecard after the competitor has handed it in and left the scoring area. The scorecard is considered to have been handed in when the competitor leaves the scoring area.

17. **ELECTRONIC DEVICES / CELL PHONES:** While electronic device/cell phone use has become a part of everyday life, the OSAA believes that appropriate and considerate use of these devices is necessary at our golf state championships.
 - a. **Players:** Players shall not take any electronic device on to the golf course, including cell phones. If a player uses such a device at any point during his/her round, he/she may be subject to disqualification.
 - b. **Coaches and Spectators:** Cell phones must be set to vibrate or silent mode and shall not ring at any time while on the golf course. Cell phone conversations are prohibited at all times while on the golf course. If you need to take/make a call, please proceed to the clubhouse or parking lot. Thank you for being considerate of all participants and spectators.
18. **PACE OF PLAY:** The OSAA and the host courses are emphasizing pace of play during this year's state championships. Groups are expected to adhere to the pace of play guidelines printed on their scorecard. A group's position should be immediately behind the group in front, not immediately in front of the group behind. Groups may be affected if they are behind the scheduled pace and out of position. Out of position is defined as:
 - a. On par 3 – Having a clear hole ahead.
 - b. On par 4 – The group ahead replaces the flagstick before your group leaves the tee area.
 - c. On par 5 – The group ahead arrives on the green before your group leaves the tee area.
19. **PLAYING COURSE ON DAYS OF CHAMPIONSHIP:** No player participating, or who may participate, in the championship shall practice or play on the golf course the days of the championship, other than during their assigned round. Violators of this policy will be disqualified from the championship.

20. **PRACTICE DURING A ROUND**: Players are not permitted to practice once their round has begun. Practice putting / chipping on or near the putting green of the hole last played is prohibited during a round. Players are not allowed to practice putting / chipping at the turn in between nines.
21. **CADDIES**: Competitors are not allowed to use caddies in the State Championship.
22. **CARTS**:
- a. **Motorized Carts – Participants** - Except as required by applicable law, participants may not use motorized golf carts in OSAA State Championships. The OSAA will evaluate, on a case-by-case basis, any request to use a motorized golf cart in OSAA State Championships due to a claimed disability. This request must be made in writing prior to the State Championship.
 - b. **Motorized Carts – Spectators** – Spectators, including coaches, may not use motorized golf carts at OSAA State Championships. The OSAA will evaluate, on a case-by-case basis, any request by a spectator to use a motorized golf cart at OSAA State Championships due to age or a disability. This request must be made in writing prior to the State Championship.
 - c. **Pull Carts – Participants** – Participants are allowed to use a pull cart in OSAA State Championships. Eagle Crest rents pull carts for \$5 per round. Please note that there are a limited number of pull carts available.
23. **RULES COMMITTEE**: The OSAA will have a Rules Committee at the State Championship. Rules Committee members will be on the course in clearly marked golf carts to answer questions and make rules interpretations as necessary. Committee members will have walkie talkies in order to collaborate on rulings.
24. **PROCEDURE WHEN RULES COMMITTEE NOT PRESENT**: If a competitor is doubtful of her rights or the correct procedure during the play of a hole she may, without penalty, complete the hole with two balls (Rule 3-3). After the doubtful situation has arisen and before taking further action, the competitor must announce to her marker or a fellow-competitor that she intends to play two balls and which ball she wishes to count if the Rules permit. If she fails to do so, the provisions of Rule 3-3b(ii) apply. Player invoking Rule 3-3 must report to the Rules Committee before turning in scorecard; penalty is disqualification.
25. **UNSPORTSMANLIKE BEHAVIOR**: A Rules Committee member may disqualify a player without warning for unsportsmanlike conduct such as throwing a club, disrespectfully addressing or striking an opponent or official, using profanity or obscene gestures, intentionally obstructing an opponent's line of play, etc.
- a. Any disqualification for unsportsmanlike conduct disqualifies the player for the entire championship. Substitution of a player disqualified for unsportsmanlike conduct is not permitted.
 - b. Disqualification for a violation of USGA rules applies to that day's competition only.
26. **SUSPENSION OF PLAY – WEATHER / LIGHTNING**: When play is suspended by the committee, if the players in a match or group are between the play of two holes, they must not resume play until the committee has ordered a resumption of play. If they have started play of a hole, they may discontinue play immediately or continue play of the hole, provided they do so without delay. If the players choose to continue play of the hole, they are permitted to discontinue play before completing it. Before lifting the ball, the player must mark its position. The players must resume play when the committee has ordered a resumption of play. An airhorn will be used to notify players of a suspension of play.
27. **CLOSE OF COMPETITION**: The competition shall be deemed to have closed when all scores have been turned in and the awards ceremony is completed.
28. **RESTROOMS / WATER ON COURSE**: Eagle Crest Ridge Course has on-course restrooms near holes 6 and 13. Restrooms are also available in the clubhouse and near the practice putting green. Water coolers will be placed around the course every few holes near the tee box.
29. **FOOD**: Eagle Crest Ridge Course has a full service snack bar / restaurant in the clubhouse.
30. **AWARDS**: All awards will be presented following the conclusion of the championship on Tuesday.
- a. **Trophies** – Champion through fourth place trophies will be awarded in each championship.
 - b. **Medals** – Medals will be presented to the champion and second place teams in each championship. Medals will also be presented to the top ten individuals at each state championship who will be recognized as members of the U.S. Bank/Les Schwab Tires All-Tournament Team.
 - c. **Flags** – The Oregon Golf Course Superintendents Association (OGCSA) has generously donated logo flags for use during each of this year's state championships. Their goal is to familiarize young golfers with the OGCSA and bring awareness to their role in the game today. The logo flags will be distributed to the top finishers at each of this year's state championships.

EAGLE CREST RIDGE COURSE – LOCAL RULES

The USGA Rules of Golf and OSAA rules will govern all play except as modified by the following Local Rules:

- A. Please disregard all local rules on the Eagle Crest Ridge Course scorecard.
- B. Play will be from the RED tee markers. All other tee markers will be removed to avoid confusion.
- C. The one ball rule is not in effect.
- D. **Obstructions (Rule 24):** The following areas are defined as obstructions:
- ◆ All cart paths
 - ◆ All man-made structures through the green
 - ◆ Sprinkler heads and sprinkler control boxes
 - ◆ 150-yard markers
 - ◆ Staked trees – relief is from the stake or protective cover only.
- E. **Abnormal Ground Conditions (Rule 25):** Casual water is any temporary accumulation of water on the course that is visible before or after the player takes his stance, and is not in a water hazard. Relief: Refer to Rule 25-1 b.
- F. **Burrowing Animal Holes:** Under note for Rule 25-1a, relief is denied for interference by stance.
- G. **Ground Under Repair (Rule 25):** Marked with white lines and all French drains.
- H. **Embedded Ball (Rule 25):** Shall be in effect “through the green”. “Through the green” is defined as the whole area of the golf course except for the teeing ground and putting green of the hole being played; and all hazards on the course. Anywhere “through the green” a ball which is embedded in its own pitch mark, except in loose sand, may be lifted without penalty, cleaned and dropped as near as possible to the spot where it lay but not nearer the hole.
- I. **Lateral Water Hazards (Rule 26):** Defined by red stakes or red lines. When both stakes and lines are present, stakes indicate the hazard and lines define the margin. Lateral water hazards exist on holes #7, 9, 12, and 18.
- J. **Out of Bounds (Rule 27):** If a ball is out of bounds the player shall play a ball, under penalty of one stroke, as nearly as possible at the spot from which the original ball was last played. A ball is out of bounds when all of it lies out of bounds. Out of bounds stakes are on nearly every hole. The starting point and finishing point of the out of bounds lines are double staked. The stake colors are all white.
- Some homeowners have put of signs on their property stating "Out of Bounds, Free Drop." These signs are to be ignored during the championship. No play is allowed from homeowner maintained property. The inside edge of all paved roadways, including public roads, are out of bounds.
- K. **Provisional Ball (Rule 27):** A player should play a provisional ball for any shot that may be lost outside a water hazard or out of bounds. The player must inform her marker or a fellow competitor that she intends to play a provisional ball, and must play it before she goes forward to search for the original ball.
- L. **Permanent Elevated Power Lines and Cables:** If a ball strikes such a line or cable, the stroke shall be canceled and the ball must be replayed without penalty. Refer to Rule 20-5.
