SUBJECT: Summary of Executive Board Action at the February 6, 2023 Meeting

At the meeting on February 6, 2023, the OSAA Executive Board took the following actions:

- Approved the minutes of the December 12 Executive Board meeting.
- Voted to forward an amendment to Article 9.10 – Equity and Diversity Advisory Committee to the Delegate Assembly's April 3 meeting for action. **(Attached)**
- Voted to approve Riverside High School (West Linn/Wilsonville SD) as a full member for 2023-24 assigned to the 3A Lewis & Clark League.
- Voted to accept the 2021-22 Audit.
- Received an initial report of the 2022 Fall State Championships revenue.
- Voted to accept and approve the Football Ad Hoc Committee Recommendations which included 2023 Special Districts and the expansion of the 1A 6-Player state championship bracket from 8 teams to 12 teams. **(Attached)**
- Voted to adopt the 2023 2A/1A Baseball/Softball State Championship Playoff Allocations. **(Attached)**
- Voted to support staff recommendations on necessary changes to the 2023 Spring State Championship locations which include 5A Tennis to West Hills RC, a location for the 3A/2A/1A Boys Golf State Championship, and flexible locations for the Baseball State Championships.
- Voted to adopt the roster for the 2022 OSAA Budget Committee. **(Attached)**
- Voted to adopt the roster for the Officials Recruitment/Retention Committee. **(Attached)**
- Voted to adopt the roster for the Basketball Shot Clock Ad Hoc Committee. **(Attached)**
- Received a proposal to adopt Girls Wrestling as an OSAA-sanctioned activity. Board unanimously supported forwarding the proposal to the April 3 Delegate Assembly meeting.
- Voted to approve cooperative sponsorships (Thurston / Mohawk – Girls Swimming, Elmira / Mapleton – Softball, Pendleton / Griswold – Boys Golf / Girls Golf, Weston-McEwen / Griswold – Baseball / Softball).
- Received a report on the Executive Board roster for 2023-24, including members eligible for re-election at the Delegate Assembly's April 3 meeting or appointment at the Executive Board's May 8 meeting.
- Received an Oregon Athletic Coaches Association (OACA) report from Rob Younger, OACA Executive Director.
- Received an Oregon Athletic Directors Association (OADA) report from Tim Sam, OADA Executive Board liaison.

Proposal to Amend Article 9.10. – Equity and Diversity Advisory Committee  
(Action Item)

**QUESTION:** *Should the Executive Board propose an amendment to the Delegate Assembly to Article 9.10. – Equity and Diversity Advisory Committee to combine two current standing committees into one joint committee creating a Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee?*

**RATIONALE:** The purpose of combining the two committees (Diversity and Equity Advisory and the Inclusion Committee) is to ensure consistent communication and efficiency are in place with OSAA committees. The Equity and Diversity Advisory Committee's focus has been about promoting ways to create the most inclusive and welcoming environment for all who attend interscholastic events. The Inclusion Committee has had a similar focus in past meetings, ensuring that access for all students in OSAA activities is discussed. The Equity and Diversity Committee will continue the necessary conversations about inclusion of all students, and if the charge of the current Inclusion Committee could be met.

**9.10. ~~Equity and Diversity~~ Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Advisory Committee**

**9.10.1 Charge.** The Committee shall serve in an advisory capacity focusing on ways to engage and meet the needs of member schools, students, and communities, particularly those from historically underrepresented populations, while applying an equity lens in all aspects of the Association's work. ***The committee will collaborate on ways to ensure an inclusive environment is provided allowing the opportunity for students, coaches, and officials to perform in a safe and welcoming setting, and to demonstrate the educational values inherent in high school activities.***

**9.10.2 The Committee shall consist of one 6A, one 5A, one 4A, one 3A, one 2A and one 1A school superintendent, assistant superintendent, high school principal or high school assistant principal; one 6A/5A, one 4A/3A and one 2A/1A school superintendent, assistant superintendent, high school principal or high school assistant principal; one athletic director representative; one activities director representative; one coach representative; one officials representative; one representative of the Oregon School Boards Association; and up to two community members. In addition, the Equity and Diversity Representative on the Executive Board shall serve as an ex-officio on the committee.**

**9.10.3** A member of the Executive Board shall serve as an ex-officio member of the Committee.

**9.10.4 Term.** Members of the Committee shall serve a three-year **renewable** term. Attention will be paid to the term limit rotation to ensure balance between experienced members and new members.

**9.10.5 Meetings.** The Committee shall adopt an annual schedule of meetings based upon the issues under consideration. The schedule shall include an appropriate number of meetings in which to conduct the business of the Committee.

SUBJECT: OSAA Football Ad Hoc Advisory Committee Update – January 25 Meeting

The Football Ad Hoc Advisory conducted its second public meeting of this school year in a hybrid model with most Committee members in-person at the OSAA Offices and several attendees via ZOOM. The goal of the Committee is to have a finalized recommendation for the Executive Board's February 6<sup>th</sup> meeting.

OSAA staff provided a summary of 10 pieces of correspondence received after the group's January 11 meeting. The Committee received testimony from eleven individuals either in-person or online representing six different schools. At the completion of the testimony, the Committee convened into a work session.

### **Play-Down Plan of Action**

The Committee discussed and came up with a set of criteria for schools to submit when petitioning to play down a classification. The school would also need to appear before the Football Ad Hoc Committee either in-person or via Zoom. The criteria consist of data from the previous four seasons regarding:

- Participation numbers by grade level (9-12)
- Win/loss records, including point differentials, for each level in the program
- Listing of any forfeits for each level in the program
- Coaching staff continuity for each level in the program
- School administration continuity
- Description of off-season programs (team camp, youth camp, 7v7/Lineman challenge, summer weights)
- Youth program participation numbers by grade level and coaching staff continuity for the past four years
- Description of school/community support and action steps taken, or planned, by the school to return the program to its original classification

### **Postseason Eligibility for Schools Playing Down a Classification**

The Committee continues to support creating a policy to allow a school to play down a classification from their original classification for an initial 2-year period. During that initial two-year period, those schools would be required to put together a Play-Down Plan of Action regarding the current state of their program, plus how they will implement changes and move back into their original classification. This potential policy would also state that, following the initial 2-year period, any school continuing to play down a classification would be ineligible for postseason play. The Committee is planning on making this one of the questions for the state Athletic Director conference in April to get the schools pulse on this topic. If such a policy was recommended, it wouldn't go into effect prior to the 2024 season.

### **Jamborees**

The Committee is supportive of recommending that schools be allowed to have their players play in more than one jamboree within the same day or week, while maintaining the current limit of a total of 36-offensive snaps for an individual player. The OSAA staff will create language for this change, plus look at similar adjustments in other jamboree policies, and get feedback from the Sports Medicine Advisory Committee (SMAC) before proposing to the Executive Board later this year.

## **Bracket Sizes**

The Committee spent time discussing bracket size, specifically as it relates to the 1A classification. The group is recommending maintaining 12 teams at 1A [8-player] and expanding the 1A [6-player] bracket from 8 teams to 12 teams for the 2023 season. All other brackets would remain at the same size as they were for the 2022 football season.

## **Final League/Special District Configuration by Classification**

The Committee reached consensus on a final recommendation of all school placements and league/district alignments for the 2023-24 football season (see attached). The OSAA Executive Board will vote on these recommendations at their February 6, 2023, meeting. Any communication received by the OSAA at this point in the process will be shared with the Executive Board for review and discussion.
