At the meeting on February 5, 2024, the OSAA Executive Board took the following actions:

- Voted to amend Board Policy – Air Quality Guidelines which focuses on the AirNow website for tracking air quality. **(Attached)**

Proposal to Amend Board Policy – Air Quality Guidelines

(Action Item)

QUESTION: Should the Executive Board amend Board Policy – Air Quality Guidelines to provide more consistency for schools when tracking air quality for practices and contests?

RATIONALE: The Sports Medicine Advisory Committee (SMAC) spent time reviewing this policy and is suggesting that the OSAA reduce the recommended websites/apps used to track air quality to provide better consistency. The AirNow Fire and Smoke Map website and app include DEQ/AirNow monitors, along with Purple Air monitors whose data has been calibrated to reflect EPA standards. This will help avoid situations where schools are seeing varied reporting data from multiple sources.

AIR QUALITY GUIDELINES

(Revised July 2022)

These guidelines, created in consultation with the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) and the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), provide a default policy to those responsible or sharing duties for making decisions concerning the cancellation, suspension and/or restarting of practices and contests based on poor air quality.

- A. **Designate Personnel:** Given the random behavior of wind and air currents, air quality may change quickly. Schools shall designate someone who will monitor the air quality prior to and during outdoor activities. While typically due to wildfires, schools need to also consider non-wildfire situations if the air quality is unhealthy.
- B. **Areas with Air near DEQ/AirNow Reporting Stations:** The Air Quality Index (AQI) should be monitored throughout the day, and during an event, to have the best data possible to make informed decisions about conducting practices and competitions. ***Schools should always defer to the monitor that is the nearest physical distance to the practice or contest facility.*** School personnel shall review the AQI information for all regions throughout the state to determine if action is necessary (see chart below). Schools shall regularly review the AQI throughout events to assess deteriorating conditions. ***School personnel shall use the AirNow Fire and Smoke Map at <https://fire.airnow.gov>. This map shows circles for DEQ/AirNow monitors and squares for Purple Air monitors. Purple Air monitors have been calibrated by EPA to provide data comparable to permanent monitors.***

- C. **Areas without Air Monitoring Stations:** Given the random behavior of factors related to the calculation of the AQI levels in different areas of the state (wind speed and direction) member schools not near a DEQ reporting station should consult with local state and/or federal authorities to help determine the AQI level in your specific area. Schools in remote areas not near a DEQ reporting station may also refer to Purple Air monitors for monitoring air quality at <https://map.purpleair.com>. The EPA's Fire and Smoke map at <https://fire.airnow.gov/> also includes the Purple Air monitors (DEQ monitors show as circles, Purple Air monitors show as squares.). If air monitoring equipment is not available, member schools should utilize the 5-3-1 Visibility Index to determine air quality.

2.b.

- 1) 5-3-1 Visibility Index: Making visual observations using the 5-3-1 Visibility Index is a simple way to estimate air quality and know what precautions to take. While this method can be useful, you should always use caution and avoid going outside if visibility is limited, especially if you are sensitive to smoke.
 - (a) Determine the limit of your visual range by looking for distant targets or familiar landmarks such as mountains, mesas, hills, or buildings at known distances. The visual range is that point at which these targets are no longer visible. As a rule of thumb: If you can clearly see the outlines of individual trees on the horizon it is generally less than five miles away. It is highly recommended that schools use pre-determined landmarks that were established on a clear day to determine their visual range.
 - (b) Ideally, the viewing of any distant targets should be made with the sun behind you. Looking into the sun or at an angle increases the ability of sunlight to reflect off of the smoke, thus making the visibility estimate less reliable.
 - (c) Be aware that conditions may change rapidly and always use the more conservative of multiple metrics (AQI, 5-3-1 Visibility Index, etc.).

D. **Act:** This chart will help determine the action needed based on the air quality in your area.

Air Quality Index (AQI)	5-3-1 Visibility Index	Required Actions for Outdoor Activities
51 -100	5-15 Miles	Athletes who are unusually sensitive to air pollution should consider indoor activities only. Athletes with asthma should have rescue inhalers readily available and pretreat before exercise if directed by their healthcare provider. All athletes with respiratory illness, asthma, lung or heart disease should monitor symptoms and reduce/cease activity if symptoms arise. Increase rest periods as needed.
101 -150	3-5 Miles	Athletes who are unusually sensitive to air pollution should consider indoor activities only. Athletes with asthma should have rescue inhalers readily available and pretreat before exercise if directed by their healthcare provider. All athletes with respiratory illness, asthma, lung or heart disease should monitor symptoms and reduce/cease activity if symptoms arise. Athletes with asthma or other lung diseases, heart conditions or diabetes may need additional rest breaks during practices / contests. Consider rescheduling to a different time and / or an area with a lower AQI. Schools should consider the impact of elevated AQI lasting for multiple days and the impact of prolonged exposure for athletes and staff on multiple practice session days when making decisions. Consider moving practices indoors , if available. Be aware that, depending on a venue's ventilation system, indoor air quality levels can approach outdoor levels.
151 -200	1-3 Miles	All outdoor activities (practice and competition) shall be canceled or moved to an area with a lower AQI. Move practices indoors, if available. Be aware that, depending on a venue's ventilation system, indoor air quality levels can approach outdoor levels.
>200	1 Mile	All outdoor activities (practice and competition) shall be canceled or moved to an area with a lower AQI. Move practices indoors, if available. Be aware that, depending on a venue's ventilation system, indoor air quality levels can approach outdoor levels.

SUBJECT: OSAA Football Ad Hoc Advisory Committee Update – January 24 Meeting

The Football Ad Hoc Advisory conducted its second and final public meeting at the OSAA office to finalize its recommendations for the OSAA Executive Board's February 5th meeting.

OSAA staff provided a summary of 17 pieces of correspondence received following the group's January 10 meeting. During the meeting the Committee received testimony from 12 individuals either in-person or online representing nine different schools. At the completion of the testimony, the Committee convened into a work session to discuss a variety of topics, review testimony, and develop its final recommendations for the Executive Board.

Final League/Special District Configuration by Classification

The Committee reviewed testimony (both written and during the meeting) and reached consensus on a final recommendation of all school placements and league/district alignments for the 2024-25 football season (see attached). The OSAA Executive Board will vote on these recommendations at their February 5, 2024, meeting.

Play Down Criteria

The Committee spent considerable time discussing potential changes to the play down criteria and how that should be utilized in conjunction with the additional criteria outlined in the policy moving forward. The group supports schools that meet the 22% or less winning percentage qualifying them for consideration to play down but not automatically moving them down. These schools would be required to submit a request with the additional criteria outlined in the policy either in person or via Zoom and the Football Ad Hoc Committee would determine whether to grant the request on a case-by-case basis. Committee members supported including a school's ADM as a factor for consideration as well. The goal of these adjustments is to reaffirm that playing down is a significant step and must be thoroughly reviewed by members of the Committee, not solely based on a percentage.

The Committee plans to explore potential additional policy/criteria for schools that don't meet the 22% or less winning percentage but demonstrate considerable difficulty maintaining the viability of their program at their current classification.

Number of Committee Meetings

The Committee supports adding an additional meeting next year to provide more opportunity for input and feedback from schools in this process. The group plans to meet during the Fall 2024 season for an initial work session and then hold four public meetings (two prior to winter break and two after winter break) before making its final recommendations to the Executive Board in February 2025.

1A 8-Player and 1A 6-Player Football

The Committee continues to support having the cutoff for 1A-8 player at 60-74. They believe the proposed leagues allow for a viable regular season and state championship playoffs for each level. The group again heard testimony during the meeting to pause the process and allow 1A schools the time to get together to further explore this issue. The group is aware that 1A Delegate Assembly members are meeting this week toward that effort. The Committee

continues to believe it has a responsibility to provide its football special districts for the Executive Board on February 5 and understands that any decision to pause to provide more time would be at the Board's discretion.

Playoff Bracket Structure/Allocations

The Committee discussed playoff bracket structure and supports maintaining the current bracket structure for 1A-6, 1A-8, 2A, 3A, 4A, and 5A classifications (see chart below for allocations). The group reviewed survey results from 6A schools and spent considerable time discussing the 6A playoffs. The survey results showed support for maintaining the Columbia Cup and support for making changes to the format. Committee members believe that more input and discussion is needed by 6A schools before making any decisions on the playoff format. A sub-committee of the Football Ad Hoc Committee will work on potential options and get feedback from 6A athletic directors and coaches at the non-league scheduling meeting in March and OADA State Conference in April to bring a proposal to the Executive Board's May 6 meeting.

Aligning Classification and Districting Petition to Play Down criteria with Football Ad Hoc Committee criteria

The Committee recommends that the Executive Board align the Classification and Districting Committee's Petition to Play Down criteria for moving a team back up with the Football Ad Hoc Committee criteria for consistency in football only. Currently, a school that met the requirements for a school-wide Petition to Play Down for all sports is subject to that policy's Dominant Team Sport Activity based on postseason success when determining if one of their teams should be moved back up to its original classification. The Football Ad Hoc Committee wants the Placement in a Different Classification – Football Only policy for moving schools back up that includes an in-class winning percentage of 67% or higher and/or advancing beyond Round 1 of any state championship to apply across the board.


