PRE-DISTRICT TOURNAMENT

2. **SCHOOLS IN YOUR DISTRICT:** www.osaa.org/activities/btn

Please confirm all the schools eligible to compete in your District Meet by reviewing the tennis districts on the OSAA website. If a school is scheduled to participate in your District Meet but doesn't appear on the OSAA website, please contact Monica Maxwell at 503.682.6722 x229 or email monicam@osaa.org prior to the start of your District Meet.

3. **CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFICATIONS:**

A. **6A** – 28-person OSAA bracket

1) **Automatic Qualifiers:** Twenty-eight singles and doubles teams automatically qualify for the OSAA's 28-person bracket. Each league determines how they will select their allotted playoff spots.

PIL – 4; Metro – 4; Pacific – 4; Mt. Hood – 4; Three Rivers – 4; Central Valley – 4; Southwest – 4

2) **Cutoff Date:** The automatic qualifiers must be determined by 10pm **Saturday, May 18.**

a) Once the qualifiers are determined, the seeding committee will seed the top eight players/doubles for the 6A.

b) Placement on the bracket will be according to USTA rules and the OSAA seeding committee process. The process includes the following exceptions:

(1) Players or doubles teams from the same district shall not meet prior to the round of sixteen for 6A.

(2) If the first and second place finishers in the district are from the same school, they shall not meet prior to the final. No players/doubles teams from the same school shall meet prior to the semifinals.

B. **5A** – 16-person OSAA bracket

1) **Automatic Qualifiers:** Sixteen singles and doubles teams automatically qualify for the OSAA's 16-person bracket. Each league determines how they will select their allotted playoff spots.

Northwest Oregon – 4; Mid-Willamette – 4; Midwestern – 4; Intermountain – 4

2) **Cutoff Date:** The automatic qualifiers must be determined by 10pm **Saturday, May 18.**

a) Once the qualifiers are determined, the seeding committee will seed the top four players/doubles for the 5A

b) Placement on the bracket will be according to USTA rules and the OSAA seeding committee process. The process includes the following exceptions:

(1) Players or doubles teams from the same district shall not meet prior to the quarterfinals for the 5A.

(2) If the first and second place finishers in the district are from the same school, they shall not meet prior to the final. No players/doubles teams from the same school shall meet prior to the semifinals.

C. **4A/3A/2A/1A** – 20-person OSAA bracket

1) **Automatic Qualifiers:** **Twenty** singles and doubles teams automatically qualify for the OSAA's 20-person bracket. Each special district determines how they will select their allotted playoff spots.

Special District 1 – 4; Special District 2 – 4; Special District 3 – 4; Special District 4 – 4; **Special District 5 - 4**

- 2) **Cutoff Date:** The automatic qualifiers must be determined by 10pm **Saturday, May 18.**
 - a) Once the qualifiers are determined, the seeding committee will seed the top four players/doubles for the 4A/3A/2A/1A.
 - b) Placement on the bracket will be according to USTA rules and the OSAA seeding committee process. The process includes the following exceptions:
 - (1) Players or doubles teams from the same district shall not meet prior to the quarterfinals for the 4A/3A/2A/1A.
 - (2) If the first and second place finishers in the district are from the same school, they shall not meet prior to the final. No players/doubles teams from the same school shall meet prior to the semifinals.

DURING DISTRICT TOURNAMENT

1. **STATE CHAMPIONSHIP INFORMATION DISTRIBUTION:** The state championship information must be downloaded from the OSAA website. Tight timelines dictate that the distribution of materials for the state championship be done at the District Tournament site. Please ensure that each coach in your district downloads the [AD & Coach Information](#) before your District Tournament. Thanks for your help with this.
2. **ADDITIONAL SEEDING INFORMATION FORM:** www.osaa.org/forms/registration/btn

ASI SUBMISSION PROCESS: *Only the online ASI form will be used to accept additional seeding information.*

It is the responsibility of the coach to ensure that the OSAA office receives the online Additional Seeding Information form(s) by **4pm, Sunday, May 19.** The OSAA and the seeding committee will not be held accountable for not seeding a participant for whom additional information has not been supplied beyond the published league or special district results.

POST DISTRICT TOURNAMENT

1. **ONLINE DISTRICT TOURNAMENT RESULTS FORM:** www.osaa.org/forms/registration/btn

At the conclusion of the District Tournament, the online District Tournament Results form must be submitted by **10pm, Saturday, May 18.** Submit your entries following the steps below. Contact Monica at 503.682.6722 x229 if you do not have the password.

Step 1: Go to the OSAA website.

Step 2: Choose your district from the drop-down menu, or switch to girls by clicking the "Switch to Girls" button.

Step 3: Enter your District Meet Director password and select "Next" to edit the entry form.

Step 4: Enter your Meet Director Information.

Step 5: Enter the number of Varsity participants for the schools.

Step 6: Complete the required information for each of your district qualifiers (#1 through #4) and note where they were seeded in your district tournament, if any.

Step 7: Click "Submit" – The form will check for missing information and will not submit until the information is complete. When the form has been submitted, you will be sent a confirmation email and given the opportunity to print the entries. The completed entry form can be modified and re-submitted until the form deadline.

Step 8: District tournament results must be submitted through TennisReporting brackets. At the conclusion of your district tournament, submit your TennisReporting "winners report". There will be an option given upon finishing the bracket.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – SEEDING / POSTINGS / CORRECTIONS / SUBSTITUTIONS

1. **STATE SEEDING COMMITTEE:** The State Seeding Committee shall consist of a representative of the OSAA, the Oregon Athletic Coaches Association Boys and Girls Tennis chairpersons, and representatives from each league and special district.
2. **SEEDING PROCEDURE:**
 - A. Eight or less seeded players or doubles teams are to be determined on each of the 6A brackets (28). They will be placed according to USTA rules.

- B. Four or less seeded players or doubles teams are to be determined on each of the 4A/3A/2A/1A brackets (16) and 5A brackets (16). They will be placed according to USTA rules.
- C. Information to be considered in determining whether a player or doubles team should be seeded – none has priority over the other:
 - District Tournament performance.
 - Tennis Reporting data.
 - Outstanding matches – Include dual match performance category tournament performances during the high school season. USTA and UTR rankings are not used for high school
 - Past State Championship performance.
 - Season record – the number of wins and losses during the season. For double teams, the number of wins and losses of each match played with the same partner during the season. Include both dual matches where one team plays another and tournament performances.

D. **6A**

Following placement of seeded players/doubles teams on each bracket, the remaining non-seeded district champions will be drawn by lot and placed on the two remaining unused seed lines. They will be placed in such a manner that they will not meet another district champion or seeded player/doubles team prior to the round of sixteen. If there are more district champions available, they will be placed in such a manner that they will not meet a seeded player or another district champion in the round of 32.

The remainder of the draw shall be by lot. EXCEPTION: Players or doubles teams from the same district shall not meet prior to the round of sixteen. If the first and second place finishers in the district are from the same school, they shall not meet prior to the final. No players/doubles teams from the same school shall meet prior to the semifinals.

E. **5A and 4A/3A/2A/1A**

Following placement of seeded players/doubles teams on each bracket, the remaining district champions will be drawn by lot and placed in such a manner that they will not play in a qualifying round or meet a seeded player/doubles team prior to the quarterfinals.

The remainder of the draw shall be by lot. EXCEPTION: Players or doubles teams from the same district shall not meet prior to the quarterfinals. If the first and second place finishers in the district are from the same school, they shall not meet prior to the final. No players/doubles teams from the same school shall meet prior to the semifinals.

3. **POSTING TIMELINES:** www.osaa.org/activities/btn

- A. All entries will be posted on the website by **4pm on Monday, May 20.**
- B. District Tournament Directors and coaches of qualifying individuals are responsible for checking the accuracy of the entry information, including correct spelling.
- C. Follow these instructions to check your district's / school's entry information:
 - 1) Access the OSAA website, click on [Brackets/ Team Scores](#) and click on your classification.
 - a) Please check all entries for correct spelling of participant's name, year in school, school name, etc.
 - b) Corrections must be received by the OSAA no later than 4pm on Tuesday, May 21.
 - c) All corrections are to be emailed to Monica Maxwell at monicam@osaa.org.
- D. Coaches and players must check the website for individual bracket position.
- E. **PLAYERS SHOULD CHECK IN IMMEDIATELY UPON ARRIVAL AND SHOULD ARRIVE AT LEAST ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THEIR SCHEDULED MATCH TIME.**

4. **STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – INDIVIDUAL SPORT SUBSTITUTIONS** (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies) (Revised Winter 2015)

- A. The following shall be the policy for substitutions in individual sport State Championship events. All individuals who are substitutes for individual qualifiers must have participated in a District or Special District Meet.

E. **Tennis**

- 1) **Singles:** Any substitutions for singles qualifiers may be made until 4pm two business days prior to the first day of the state championships.
 - a) If a singles player is replaced after the start of the seeding meeting for the state championships, the replaced person is not eligible to replace someone else on a doubles team.
- 2) **Doubles:** Any changes in doubles qualifiers may be made until 4pm two business days prior to the first day of the state championship.

A doubles player may be replaced only by another team member who is no higher on the team ladder than the player they are replacing.

5. **WITHDRAWAL FROM STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS** (*OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies*) *(Revised Fall 2008)*

By entering participants in a state championship meet, contest or tournament, each member school certifies that, barring injury, illness or unforeseen events, or a withdrawal to avoid violating the religious convictions of team members, the team or individuals representing the school will participate in every game or competition, that is part of that championship event, until the final conclusion of the meet, contest or championship. Any withdrawal or intentional forfeiture for reasons other than those specified shall be considered a sportsmanship violation, and shall be subject to reprimand and/or other penalties as determined by the Executive Board. SPECTATOR CONDUCT

- A. All cheers, comments and actions shall be in direct support of one's team. No cheers, comments or actions shall be directed at one's opponent or at contest officials. Some examples of unacceptable conduct include but are not limited to: disrespecting players by name, number or position; negative cheers or chants; throwing objects on the playing surface; use of derogatory or racially explicit language; discriminatory harassment or conduct that creates a hostile environment that is disruptive to the educational environment.
- B. Spectators shall not turn their heads or hold up newspapers during team introductions, or jeer at cheerleaders during opposing team introductions.
- C. Spectators shall not be permitted to use vulgar/offensive or racially/culturally insensitive language or engage in any racially/culturally insensitive action.
- D. Spectators are not permitted to have signs or banners (larger than 8 ½ by 11 inches), confetti, balloons or glass containers. "Fathead" type items are considered signs and shall not be larger than 8 ½ by 11 inches. Spectators are required to wear shirts.
- E. Spectators are not permitted to have artificial noisemakers. Some examples of artificial noisemakers are Thunder Stix, cowbells, clappers and air horns.
- F. Spectators who fail to comply with Association or site management spectator conduct expectations may be expelled from the contest.
