- 1) If you select Mobile Delivery, your phone is your ticket. Locate your tickets in your account or in your app on your mobile phone. Mobile Delivery tickets are not available to print and will not be emailed to your phone.

4. **FINALS SITE:**

- A. All persons must have a ticket or pass to enter.
- B. Student is any child age 5 & up through a senior in high school.
- C. Gates open at 8:15am.
- D. Will Call window is located at the main entrance.
- E. VISA / MasterCard / Discover / AMEX accepted at this site.
- F. Ticket good for both the morning and afternoon performances. Re-entry through Gate 10 with ticket stub AND hand stamp.
- G. **Bus Drivers:** Schools are responsible for all bus driver admissions. The OSAA does not provide passes for bus drivers.
- H. **Passes:** ONLY the OSAA Gold Card, OSAA VIP pass, OSAA Media pass, and Cheer Media pass which will admit the bearer only with photo ID, are to be honored at any OSAA State Championship event. No school, athletic district, officials' association, etc., passes are to be accepted.

1. **CHEERLEADING RULES:** <http://www.osaa.org/docs/handbooks/chehandbook.pdf>

2. **ALTERNATES** (*Cheerleading Handbook, Eligibility*): Each squad may bring two alternates to the Cheerleading State Championships in addition to the maximum number of participants allowed by the division constraints. Alternates must be

listed on the Registration Form and shall satisfy the same eligibility requirements as other Cheerleading State Championships participants, except that alternates may be members of the junior varsity or freshman squads.

3. **COACHES CERTIFICATION** (*Cheerleading Handbook, Eligibility*): Coaches must meet all OSAA Certification requirements, including the yearly OSAA Spirit Safety Clinic in order for their teams to be eligible. See OSAA Handbook, **Executive Board Policies, "Certification – Athletic Directors and Coaches"** for more information.
4. **DIVISIONS** (*Cheerleading Handbook, State Championship Registration*): The divisions at the Cheerleading State Championships shall include varsity level squads based upon school classification and squad gender as indicated below. NOTE: Squads with one or more male squad members shall participate in a Coeducational Division. Once Divisions have been established, changes will not be permitted.

5. **MINIMUM DIVISION ENTRY** (*Cheerleading Handbook, State Championship Registration*): If fewer than the designated number of entries registers to compete in any given division, the division shall be combined with another division.
6. **DIVISION CHANGES**: The schedule and divisions will be set based upon registration forms received. **Once Divisions have been established, changes will not be permitted.**
7. **CANCELLATIONS**: If, for whatever reason (illness, injury, etc.), you must drop your squad from competition, please notify Kelly Foster, 503.682.6722 x233 at the OSAA immediately.
8. **STUNTS**: If you have questions regarding the legality of a stunt, please contact the Head Technical Judge, Haley Thomas cheerleading.sri@osaa.org or 503.887.9197
9. **PROPS** (*Cheerleading Handbook, Performance Requirements*): Pom-poms, megaphones, hand-held signs and flags or the equivalent are the only acceptable props.
10. **MUSIC** (*Cheerleading Handbook, State Championship Rules and Procedures, Performance Procedures, Music*): **All teams must provide their own MP3 device or smart phone for use on the event provided sound system. Music must be recorded at the correct tempo. Although it is not recommended due to interference that may be caused during a routine, a smart phone may be used for playing music. No cover may be on any MP3 player or smart phone so that an auxiliary cord may be easily inserted into the device. Please ensure that jacks are clean and free of any debris which may impact connectivity. You must ensure that your device has a jack into which an auxiliary cord may be inserted. Note that you may need to acquire an adapter in advance if your player does not have a headphone jack. One or several selections of music may be used as long as they follow the music licensing rules.**

Please keep your routine music in your possession until you are called to enter the performance floor. You will hand carry your music to the sound table.

Advisors/Coaches/Directors are asked to remain at the sound table while their squad performs and to take their music with them at the conclusion of the performance. Representatives will be asked to press "play" and "stop" for their routines.

There will be no sound checks permitted on the main sound system.

Competition music must be properly licensed, and a team must be able to provide proof of licensing (upon request).

Additional Reminders:

- A. Remember that "special effects" recorded on your performance CD must be recorded in stereo in order to be broadcast by the Coliseum equipment. Contact Kelly Foster if you have any questions about this requirement.
- B. As a precaution, it is strongly recommended that in addition to a cell phone, iPod or CD, a backup version be available in case of audio difficulties. Not all burned CDs work on the audio equipment.

- C. Although not specified in the rules, judges have recommended that music be used to support less than half of the total performance. Coaches are also reminded to make sure that the lyrics of the music used are appropriate for a public high school performance.

11. REGISTRATION AND PASSES:

- A. Coaches should enter with their teams through the "Stage Door" entrance at the North end of the Coliseum near the Broadway Bridge.
- B. Registration begins at 7am and will remain open until 3pm.
- C. ***At registration each school will receive:***
- 1) Passes for each coach and participant (including alternates) listed on the Official Registration Form. The passes must be worn by coaches and students at all times (except during performances).
 - 2) Participant and coach passes will gain admittance for the entire event.
 - 3) Persons without passes will be required to purchase tickets to the competition.

12. DEPARTURE PACKETS:

- A. Departure Packets will be located at the OSAA Event Office.
- B. Packets will include –
- 1) Score Sheets
 - 2) Participation certificates and stickers

13. CHAMPIONSHIP SCHEDULE: [Championship Schedule](#)

This schedule contains the performance order, team photo schedule, check-in time, practice schedule and performance time.

A. Performance Order:

- 1) **IMPORTANT:** Please reconfirm your performance order on the OSAA website prior to the contest. Any revisions in performance order due to drops, etc., received by noon on Friday, February 14, will be posted by 4pm Friday.
- 2) Your team may do last minute stretching and warm-up prior to your performance in your team room or in the concourse practice area before taking your spot in the "on-deck" area just down the stairs from the concourse practice area. Remember, however, that your team will be assessed a 10- point penalty if you practice stunts in your team room.
- 3) Please Note: There will be no changing of clothes in the team rooms. Team members must change in the male or female restrooms.

- B. **Team Photos:** The photographer will be located in the Georgia Pacific room again this year. Teams will be assigned an official picture time **prior** to their scheduled practice time. Please be sure to review the Team Picture Schedule for your scheduled time. Winning teams may also have pictures taken after the competition if they wish.

C. Practice Schedule:

- 1) Practice / Warm Up will take place on the Upper Concourse area approximately 30 minutes prior to your anticipated performance time. There will be ONE mat station (with five panels) for each classification, with nine minutes allotted per team. The time will end approximately 15 minutes prior to performance time. Tosses, stunts, and music will be allowed on these mats. There will not be assigned judges to critique your practices. Judges will be available to answer questions. You are not required to use your assigned practice time, but no other scheduled practice time will be allowed for your squad. In addition to the practice floor, there will be a strip of mats for tumbling available on the concourse. No tosses will be allowed. Please be courteous of other team's needs on this shared space.
- 2) There will be an open tumbling strip available, please be courteous and share the space.
- 3) Practice on the performance surface in the arena is not allowed.
- 4) There will be five panel cheer mats in the practice area, and nine panel mats on the arena floor.

- 14. TEAM ENTRANCE ONTO THE PERFORMANCE FLOOR:** In an effort to expedite the teams entering and exiting the performance floor, here are a few guidelines we are asking teams to follow:

- A. After teams are checked at the "On Deck" area, and as soon as the previous team exits the performance mat, the next team will move forward to await their name to be called by the announcer.
 - B. Teams who wish to do a unity cheer should do so at this time. As soon as the team name is announced, they should "spirit" quickly onto the performance mat and take their starting positions; this would be preferable to marching onto the mat slowly.
 - C. When their routine is completed, the team may again exhibit their enthusiasm and spirit as they exit the performance floor.
 - D. A team's entrance and exit from the arena floor are not part of the scored performance.
 - E. **Coaches only (not alternates or JV team members) will be allowed on the performance floor during their team's performance.**
- 15. JUDGES PANEL:** Two panels of judges will be used with continuous performances alternating before the two panels. There will be no pauses between performances unless a judging panel has back-to-back performances. Squads will need to be ready to go immediately when introduced.
- 16. SAFETY JUDGING AND INSPECTION:**
- A. Safety judges will not be evaluating performances during practice times. They will be available to answer any questions that coaches may have.
 - B. Jewelry and nails will be inspected in the On-deck area and any found to be in violation of the rules will have to be modified prior to the performance, or a violation will be assessed. Coaches are reminded of the NFHS rule statement, "Loose, baggy clothes, nylon hose/tights are not appropriate for stunting squads."
 - C. If you have any questions about the legality of a particular stunt or about appropriate apparel, please contact the Head Technical Judge and OSAA State Rules Interpreter, Haley Ward: 503.887.9197 or cheerleading.sri@osaa.org.
- 17. PARTICIPANT SEATING:** Team members may sit and leave their belongings in the "corner" seating sections at the Coliseum (Sections 24, 25, 3 & 4). The center seating sections are reserved for ticketed spectators. The two rows directly behind the judges are closed to all participants and spectators. Coaches reserved seats behind the two-judge buffer rows are for coaches only.
- 18. SEATING FOR COACHES:** A section behind the two judge buffer rows has been reserved for COACHES ONLY. Only those persons listed as coaches in the Official Program may sit in the reserved area.
- 19. COLISEUM RULES:** The coliseum does not allow signs, banners, balloons or "outside" food anywhere in the facility.
- 20. [RULE 3 – CONTESTS – SPORTSMANSHIP – CROWD CONTROL](#) (OSAA Handbook, Rules) (See Attached)**
- 21. [STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – BROADCASTING/STREAMING](#) (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies) ([OSAA for Media](#)) (Revised July 2019)**
- A. The OSAA owns the ***broadcasting / streaming*** rights to ***all*** state championship events, first round ***contests*** through ***the*** championship finals. ***Radio and television stations, cable companies, websites and social media accounts planning to broadcast / stream games in any round of the OSAA state championships must register with the OSAA by submitting an online Registration Form. Registered and approved broadcasts / streams will be listed on the OSAA State Championships Broadcast Schedule. Those not listed will not be allowed.***
 - B. ***For OSAA state championship events hosted by member schools, it shall be the responsibility of those registered and approved to contact the host school's athletic director to arrange for space, power and Internet access if available. The OSAA will coordinate these arrangements at all final sites and semifinal sites for football only.***
 - C. ***The NFHS Network is the exclusive video broadcast rights holder of the OSAA state championship events. Live and on-demand video of OSAA state championship events (full or condensed versions) is strictly prohibited and in direct violation of the OSAA's agreement with the NFHS Network. Those registered and approved for broadcasting / streaming state championship events declined by the NFHS Network shall pay a rights fee to the OSAA.***
 - D. ***Video highlights are limited to a total of two minutes per game, including broadcasts, streams and social media posts.***
- 22. [STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – VIDEOTAPING](#) (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies) ([OSAA for Media](#)) (Revised July 2019)**
- A. ***Recording video of OSAA state championships from seating areas is allowed provided the view of spectators is not obstructed. Use of a tripod in seating areas is prohibited due to safety reasons. An official school video recorder, identified prior to an OSAA state championship event by the head coach or athletic director of a participating school, will be allowed in a designated area established by the OSAA.***

- B. **Recording video** is for private use only. **Broadcasting or streaming video, live or delay**, is prohibited unless an **online Registration Form has been submitted and approved by the OSAA**. **Those approved for broadcasting / streaming OSAA state championship events declined by the NFHS Network shall pay a rights fee to the OSAA.**
23. **STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – MEDICAL CHAIN OF COMMAND** (*OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies*) (Effective Fall 2012): The OSAA provides an official medical team that consists of State of Oregon registered athletic trainers and/or licensed physicians at state championship events administered by OSAA staff whenever possible. If provided, this OSAA designated medical team shall have final authority on all injury evaluations, participation status and return-to-play decisions.
24. **ATHLETIC TRAINER:** The OSAA will provide a certified trainer to respond in case of injuries at the contest. The trainer will be available to respond to emergencies; however, teams may wish to provide their own trainer if they anticipate the need for precautionary taping, etc.
25. **SERVICE ANIMALS:** Trained guide dogs and service animals assisting guests are welcome at OSAA State Championships. All other animals are prohibited. All service animals must remain on a leash or in a harness, and be in full control of the handler, at all times. Handlers are responsible for any damage or injuries caused by their animals, must properly dispose of waste in appropriate containers and must take appropriate precautions to prevent property damage or injury.
26. **LOST AND FOUND:** During the event, Lost & Found will be at the Guest Information Booth located at Entry CC. The Guest Services staff will assist you with questions, wheelchair escorts, Assisted Listening Devices and Lost and Found inquiries during events. If you lose something during an event, stop by one of our information booths and fill out a Lost & Found form. Make sure to stop by after the event and double check if your item has been turned in. Lost and Found items may be picked up from the Facility Security department, Monday through Friday 9am to 4pm. 27. **AWARDS:** Trophies and medals will be presented at the conclusion of the morning and afternoon performances (refer to performance schedule).
- A. **Trophies:** Trophies will be presented to 50% of the teams in a division up to a maximum of five in each division.
- B. **Medals:** Individual medals will be presented to both the champion and second place teams in each division.

- The judges' scores will be computer tabulated. The computer summary sheet for all teams as well as the team specific score sheets from each judge will be included in the packets available to coaches at the competition headquarters ("Press Room") immediately following each awards ceremony. Excerpt 2019-2020 OSAA Handbook, Rules

3. Rule 3 – Contests – Sportsmanship – Crowd Control.

- 3.1. The arrangement of all festivals, meets, contests or championships is the responsibility of the superintendent, assistant superintendent or high school principal, subject to the Regulations of the Association.
- 3.2. When a festival, meet, contest or championship is in progress, the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) rules governing such activities shall apply, except for specific deviations as approved by the Executive Board.
- 3.3. **Sportsmanship Responsibility.** The high school **administration**, coach and other responsible officials of each member school shall take all reasonable measures to ensure that the school's coaches, players, students and **spectators** maintain a sportsmanlike attitude **at** all events so that events may be conducted without unreasonable danger or disorder. All cheers, comments and actions shall be in direct support of one's team. **Discriminatory harassment and bullying behavior will not be tolerated. Discrimination is defined as (OAR 581-021-0045(1)(a)) "any act that unreasonably differentiates treatment, intended or unintended, or any act that is fair in form but discriminatory in operation, either of which is based on age, disability, national origin, race, color, marital status, religion, sex, and sexual orientation." Harassing conduct may take many forms, including verbal acts and name-calling; graphic and written statements, which include use of cell phones or the Internet; or other conduct that may be physically threatening, harmful, or humiliating. Examples include but are not limited to hazing, intimidation, bullying, cyberbullying or menacing another, or engaging in behavior deemed by the member school to endanger the safety or well-being of students, employees, self or others. Harassment does not have to include intent to harm, be directed at a specific target, or involve repeated incidents. Harassment creates a hostile environment when the conduct is sufficiently severe, pervasive or persistent, so as to interfere with or limit the ability to participate in or benefit from the services, activities, or opportunities offered by a school. This includes the use of, or engagement in, abusive verbal expression or physical conduct, especially if that conduct interferes with the performance of students, staff, event officials or sponsors of interscholastic activities.**
- 3.4. **Spectator Conduct.** *The following expectations regarding spectator conduct at all OSAA sanctioned events, including regular and post season competition, are provided. Those violating or threatening to violate the following Association rules or site management spectator conduct expectations, may be ejected from the premises, issued a trespass citation, excluded from sanctioned activities temporarily or permanently and/or referred to law enforcement officials.*
 - 3.4.1. *All cheers, comments and actions shall be in direct support of one's team. No cheers, comments or actions shall be directed at one's opponent or at contest officials. Some examples of unacceptable conduct include but are not limited to: disrespecting players by name, number or position; negative cheers or chants; throwing objects on the playing surface; use of derogatory or racially explicit language; discriminatory harassment or conduct that creates a hostile environment that is disruptive to the educational environment.*
 - 3.4.2. *Spectators shall not be permitted to use vulgar/offensive or racially/culturally insensitive language or engage in any racially/culturally insensitive action.*
- 3.5. **Complaint Process.** *The OSAA will sanction schools whom it has found negligent in the duties of reasonably protecting those involved in interscholastic activities from derogatory or inappropriate names, insults, verbal assaults, profanity, ridicule or engaging in behavior deemed by the member school to endanger the safety or well-being of students, employees, self or others.*
 - 3.5.1. *OSAA will acknowledge receipt of the complaint within 48 hours.*
 - 3.5.2. *OSAA may prioritize the investigation of complaints based on information received.*
 - 3.5.3. *Complaints deemed to be employee or student discipline matters only shall be returned to the complainant. Matters of employment and/or employee discipline which can best be resolved through*

the school district's complaint process include but are not limited to: playing time, team level assignments (Varsity/JV), assignment of a student to a specific coach, equipment use, or dissatisfaction with a contract or payment term. Matters of student discipline which can best be resolved through the school district's complaint process include but are not limited to: academic eligibility, drug/alcohol use, playing time or playing position, specific workout requirements, or dissatisfaction with a calendar, schedule or event location.

- 3.5.4. *Complaints must include the complainant's name and contact information (phone and email or mailing address). Anonymous complaints shall not be considered.*
- 3.5.5. *Every effort will be made to complete the investigation process within 30 days; however, should the investigation require more time, a 30-day status update shall be provided.*
- 3.5.6. *To assist in investigation of the complaint, complainants are asked to note the following:*
 - (a) *Complaints are only accepted on the official online form and each section of the Complaint Form must be completed. (Complaint Form)*
 - (b) *Complaints which are determined to be outside the scope of the OSAA will be returned to the complainant via the contact address provided. See Rule 3.5.3 for guidance.*
 - (c) *Whenever possible, provide first-hand accounts, with names and contact information of witnesses.*

3.6. **Sportsmanship Violations/Penalties.** *When the coaches, players, students, staff or spectators of any member school engage in unsportsmanlike conduct, **discriminatory harassing behaviors, act in a manner disruptive to the school environment, or cause** disorder or infliction of damage to persons or property in connection with any festival, meet, contest or championship sponsored by this Association, the Executive Board may treat such acts as a violation by the school of the Rules of the Association **and the school shall be subject to penalty. Penalties may vary depending on the actions taken by the school and/or school district during and after the event as it relates to trespassing spectators involved, removing players/coaches from the team for a period of time, requiring additional education/training, etc. Upon a ruling by the Executive Director or by the Executive Board the member school may be subject to probation, mandatory appearance before the Executive Board, required plan of action, forfeitures, fines, lack of institutional control penalties, suspension of membership or expulsion from the Association as determined by the Executive Board. The Executive Director or the Executive Board may determine that no penalties are necessary when an incident has been handled appropriately and in a timely fashion by the school and/or district.***

- 1. Q. Is the host school exclusively responsible for crowd control?
 - A. No. While the host school for any activity must assume a primary responsibility for the physical management of the activity, including providing for crowd control, this is a mutual responsibility. The visiting school also must take such measures as are necessary to insure proper behavior on the part of its own students and fans.
- 2. Q. May home team schools display signs and/or banners at their home venues?
 - A. Yes, home team schools may display "permanent" signs and/or banners that are positive / supportive at their home venues. Examples are welcome signs, in-season rosters, league banners, league / state championship banners and sportsmanship banners.
- 3. Q. Are "run through" signs allowed?
 - A. Yes, so long as the message is positive/supportive.
- 4. Q. May visiting schools bring signs and/or banners to hang at the host school's venue?
 - A. No.
- 5. Q. **May spectators have signs at events?**
 - A. **Spectators are not permitted to have signs or banners larger than 8-1/2 x 11 inches. "Fathead" type items are considered signs and shall not be larger than 8-1/2 x 11 inches. Spectators are required to wear shirts.**
- 6. Q. **May a spectator have an artificial noisemaker?**
 - A. **No, spectators are not permitted to have artificial noisemakers. Some examples of artificial noisemakers are Thunder Stix, cowbells, clappers and air horns.**

7. Q. May a school use an artificial noisemaker at specific times during athletic events?
A. In limited cases, yes. An example of an allowable use of artificial noisemakers by a school would be the firing of a cannon or the ringing of a bell after a touchdown is scored.
8. Q. May spectators use small, handheld megaphones?
A. Yes, **provided they are not electric**. Only cheerleaders are allowed to use large megaphones. Neither cheerleaders nor spectators may use megaphones for banging on the floor or bleachers.
9. Q. What are some examples of cheers that do not encourage a positive atmosphere?
A. Any yell that is intended to antagonize an opponent detracts from a positive atmosphere. "Air Ball! Air Ball!" booing, "You! You! You!", or "You Got Swatted!" are examples of yells that will not encourage a positive atmosphere. Conversely, a positive atmosphere is created when fans focus on positive yells in support of their team, rather than on negative yells attacking their team's opponents. **Spectators shall not turn their heads or hold up newspapers during team introductions, or jeer at cheerleaders during opposing team introductions.**
10. Q. May students stand on the bottom row of the bleachers?
A. Yes, but when they sit down, they must be seated on the second row.
11. Q. May students cheer during serves in volleyball and free throws in basketball?
A. Yes, so long as they are just "making noise" and not specifically addressing a contest official or an individual player from the opposing team.
12. Q. May a school use balloons at an athletic event?
A. Yes, a host school may use balloons for decoration. However, fans may not have balloons, and balloons may not be placed by the school in any manner that would block spectator viewing.
13. Q. May a school use balloons at a state championship final site?
A. No.
14. Q. May spectators have oversized foam fingers at athletic events?
A. Yes, they are allowed so long as they are not blocking spectator viewing.
