District 3 - Benton, Lane, Linn Counties.

District 4 - Douglas, Coos, Curry Counties.

District 5 - Josephine, Jackson, Klamath, Lake Counties.

District 6 - Crook, Deschutes, Jefferson, Wheeler, Gilliam, Sherman, Wasco, Hood River Counties.

District 7 - Grant, Harney, Umatilla, Morrow Counties.

District 8 - Baker, Union, Malheur, Wallowa Counties.

The quarter-final games will be played as follows:

District 1 vs. 2
District 3 vs. 4
District 5 vs. 6
District 7 vs. 8

The semifinal games will be played as follows:

Winner of District 1 and 2 plays winner of District 3 and 4.
Winner of District 5 and 6 plays winner of District 7 and 8.

The quarter-finals shall be played on the home field of District 2, 4, 6, and 8. The games may be played elsewhere by mutual agreement. Any team refusing to comply with these rules shall automatically forfeit the game.

The location of the semifinals and championship game shall be decided by the Board of Control.

Each district shall have a committee of three "B" school administrators and this committee shall meet by October 1, to work out plans for the district championship selection peculiar to that district not otherwise covered by these rules. (In the formulation of said plans, consideration shall be given all schools.) It shall be the duty of the chairman of this committee

Point 2. Basis for team selection

The state shall be divided into four districts:

District 1 - Columbia, Clatsop, Tillamook, Washington, Multnomah, Clackamas, Marion, Linn, Benton, Lincoln, Polk, Yamhill Counties.

District 2 - Hood River, Wasco, Sherman, Gilliam, Wheeler, Crook, Deschutes, Jefferson Counties.

District 3 - Morrow, Umatilla, Union, Wallowa, Baker, Grant, Malheur, Harney Counties.

District 4 - Lake, Klamath, Jackson, Josephine, Curry, Coos, Douglas, Lane Counties, Shedd and Halsey of Linn County.

The semifinal game will be played as follows:

District 1 vs. 4
District 3 vs. 2

Each district shall have a committee of three "B" school administrators and this committee shall meet by October 1, to work out plans for the district championship selection peculiar to that district, not otherwise covered by these rules. (In the formulation of said plans, consideration shall be given all schools.) It shall be the duty of the chairman of this committee to send a copy of the plan to the O.S.A.A. office for approval before notifying schools in the district. The district committee shall continue to represent its district in the semifinal games.

In the championship flight, tie games shall be decided as follows: the team registering the highest total net yardage shall be declared the winner-- if net yardage shall be equal the team registering the most first downs shall be considered the winner.

EXCEPTION: Should the championship game end in a tie, the participating teams shall be declared co-champions.

Any team refusing to comply with these rules shall automatically forfeit the game.

The location of the semifinals and championship games shall be decided by the Board of Control.

District Officials to work for the district to be determined not later than March and the O.S.A.A. office is to be notified.

After conferring with the State Board of Health and the State Department of Education our Board of Control has ruled that in district basketball tournaments not more than three (3) games in a seven consecutive day period shall be played and that all plans be approved by the Board.

Basketball Districts and Committees

"A-1" and "A-2" Districts and "A-1" and "A-2" and "B" committees were published in our September 1956 Bulletin.

"B" Basketball Districts for 1956-57 are as follows:

District 1 will include the following counties: Clatsop, Columbia, Tillamook, Washington, and Yamhill.

District 2 will include the following counties: Clackamas, Multnomah, Marion, Polk, Lincoln, (Gates, Mill City, and Scio of Linn County.)

District 3 will include the following counties: Benton, Lane, and Linn.

District 4 will include the following counties: Douglas, Coos, and Curry.

District 5 will include the following counties: Josephine, Jackson, Klamath & Lake.

District 6 will include the following counties: Crook, Deschutes, Jefferson, William, Sherman, Wasco, Hood River, and Fossil of Wheeler County.

District 7 will include the following counties: Grant, Harney, Umatilla, Morrow, and Spray & Mitchell of Wheeler County.

District 8 will include the following counties: Baker, Union, Malheur, and Wallowa.
