3. DISCUSSION BY CAUCUS GROUPS

a. Organization of All-State Recognition

Positive recognition of students is one of the top priorities of all people connected with high school activities. Over time, the OSAA has witnessed a decline and fragmentation of all-state recognitions, especially as it relates to team sports. Many sports rely upon a single coach or entity to spearhead while other sports or classifications have no recognition at all. In addition, the number of inquiries received by the OSAA has significantly increased as to how the teams are being selected and where to find the results. OSAA staff believes there is a desire by coaches, students, and fans to standardize this process and ensure that all sports (including individual sports) and classifications are recognized.

Does your school, league, classification support the OSAA forming a committee to explore the Association administering all-state teams in each classification? Should both team and individual sports all-state teams be a part of the discussion?

b. Petition to Play Up

Current OSAA policy states that the only time a school may petition to play up is during the Classification and Districting committee process at the start of a classification cycle. Additionally, current OSAA policy states that petitions to play up apply to all programs in a school. The OSAA has received inquiries from member schools asking about requesting to play up a classification in all activities during the four-year time block. The OSAA also received a request by a member school to play up a classification during the four-year time block, but only in one sport.

Does your school, league, classification support changing current policy to allow schools to petition to play up in all programs during the four-year time block? Should such a request only be allowed in the middle of the four-year time block? Should a school making this request be required to have support from the league/classification they are leaving and joining?

c. Football - Participation Limitations

The OSAA Sports Medicine Advisory Committee supports a recommendation from the Football Ad Hoc Committee to push the first contest date earlier in the calendar which would allow football teams to play their nine games over a ten-week period. The first practice date would not change, but this change would allow teams to play a game during what is traditionally jamboree week (Week 0). Pros include increased flexibility in scheduling, in-season rest/recovery period (bye week), rescheduling potential for air quality/heat cancellations, reduced strain on officials' availability. Cons include a loss of jamborees for some schools and a tighter window for acclimatization at the start of season. The proposal, if applied to next Fall, would have practices starting on August 19 and allow contests or jamborees on August 30 (rather than September 5).

Does your school, league, classification support the concept of allowing football contests a week earlier so schools may schedule their nine games over a ten-week period?

d. Practice Limitation Rule

The Practice Limitation Rule pilot has been in place for seven years at the 6A classification and added the 5A and 4A classifications in recent years. The OSAA staff believes a thorough review is needed to determine whether the intent of the original pilot has changed, as well as clarify interpretations of different scenarios for member schools. Additionally, though OSAA staff has had a few inquiries from 3A, 2A, 1A schools about aligning with 6A, 5A, 4A schools, most smaller schools seem to believe the current policy best fits their classifications.

6A, 5A, 4A Schools – What concerns, clarifications, or adjustments would your school, league, classification like to see to the Practice Limitation Rule (6A, 5A, 4A)?

3A, 2A, 1A Schools – Does your school, league, classification want to keep the Practice Limitation Rule (3A, 2A, 1A) as currently written?
