## 2023-24 OSAA ADOPTED SOCCER RULES INTERPRETATIONS

The 2023-24 NFHS Soccer Rules Book will be used in all OSAA sanctioned competitions with the following clarifications. The term "referee" used throughout refers to the center referee or head referee depending on the system of officiating.

| 1-1 | If a field is, or appears to be, larger or smaller than the dimensions specified, the referee will bring that to the attention <br> of the game-site administrator and/or the home team's head coach and will include that information on the game <br> report. The contest will still be played. |

| 1-5-3 | Both teams shall be on the same side of the field. |
| Teams cannot share players from the opposing school (e.g., a team that is playing shorthanded cannot temporarily |  |

\begin{array}{|ll|}\hline \text { 5-2-2d } & \begin{array}{l}\text { Although the NFHS rule calls for a single meeting between officials, captains, and head coaches, such a meeting is not } \\
\text { required for OSAA-sanctioned contests. Officials must obtain a complete roster and inquire of each head coach } \\
\text { whether their players are properly and legally equipped before the game as per 5-2-2d(4). This is done independently } \\
\text { from meeting with the captains to discuss sportsmanship and conduct the coin toss as provided in 5-2-2d(2) \& (3). }\end{array} \\
\hline \text { 5-4-1a } & \begin{array}{l}\text { Officials do not need to verify scores after the game (see OSAA adopted interpretation of 6-3). After the game, the } \\
\text { officials should immediately leave the field and its immediate surroundings. }\end{array} \\
\hline \text { 6-1 } & \begin{array}{l}\text { Ball holders are optional, but are highly recommended. If provided, there shall be at least two ball holders. }\end{array}

\hline If a timer, clock operator, or visible timing device is not available, then time shall be kept by the referee who shall <br>
continue to use the approved timing signals and no visible clock is to be used. (E.g., the home team wants to use the <br>
stadium clock without an operator and stop the clock in under five minutes left in each half. This would not be allowed. <br>

Time would be kept by the referee and the stadium clock would not be used to display the game time at any point.)\end{array}\right\}\)| The referee shall be the official scorekeeper. |

| The duration of the game shall be two equal halves of 40 minutes each (this includes varsity and sub-varsity matches). |
| Leagues/districts may adopt policies to reduce the duration of sub-varsity halves, provided they are still equal. |
