



## Oregon School Activities Association

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### March 11, 2021 Clarifications/Updates

The OSAA Staff plans to send regular updates to schools with clarifications based on recent communication with the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) regarding common questions for indoor and outdoor recreation policies and protocols.

Please see the latest updates below. NOTE: there have been no updates to the indoor guidance.

#### OUTDOOR SPECTATOR GUIDANCE

- Per the updated [Sector Guidance — Outdoor Recreation and Outdoor Fitness Establishments and Guidance FAQs – Outdoor Recreation and Fitness Establishments](#):
  - o Spectators in the stands are considered separate from the players, coaches, etc. on the field.
  - o Spectators must be in a designated area with separate entrances, exits and restrooms from the sports participants, that is at least six (6) feet from the sports activities.
  - o A physical distancing monitor must be assigned to ensure compliance with the maximum capacity limits for spectators.
  - o Face coverings and contact tracing requirements remain in effect.
  
- Outdoor Full Contact Sports (Football)
  - o Extreme Risk – 120 maximum field capacity for coaches, officials, players, etc.; Spectator Capacity – 50 maximum in each designated spectator area with separate entrances, exits and restrooms.
  - o High Risk – 120 maximum field capacity for coaches, officials, players, etc.; Spectator Capacity – 75 maximum in each designated spectator area with separate entrances, exits and restrooms.
  - o Moderate Risk – 150 maximum field capacity for coaches, officials, players, etc.; Spectator Capacity – 150 maximum in each designated spectator area with separate entrances, exits and restrooms.
  - o Lower Risk – 300 maximum field capacity for coaches, officials, players, etc.; Spectator Capacity – 300 maximum in each designated spectator area with separate entrances, exits and restrooms.

- Outdoor Sports (Soccer, Cross Country)
  - o Extreme Risk – 50 maximum field capacity for coaches, officials, players, etc.; Spectator Capacity – 50 maximum in each designated spectator area with separate entrances, exits and restrooms.
  - o High Risk – 75 maximum field capacity for coaches, officials, players, etc.; Spectator Capacity – 75 maximum in each designated spectator area with separate entrances, exits and restrooms.
  - o Moderate Risk – 150 maximum field capacity for coaches, officials, players, etc.; Spectator Capacity – 150 maximum in each designated spectator area with separate entrances, exits and restrooms.
  - o Lower Risk – 300 maximum field capacity for coaches, officials, players, etc.; Spectator Capacity – 300 maximum in each designated spectator area with separate entrances, exits and restrooms.

#### STATEWIDE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR TRAVEL

- The OHA has updated their [Statewide Recommendations for Travel](#) which states that K-12 sports is considered “essential travel.” Therefore, travelling out-of-state for contests would not require a quarantine upon return.
